(B) individuals and families of very low income.

(2) "Eligible individuals and families" means individuals and families of extremely low and very low income who reside in a colonia.

(b) The department shall establish the colonia down payment assistance program to provide down payment assistance to individuals and families of extremely low and very low income who would otherwise remain in substandard colonias. Down payment assistance may be provided in the form of low-interest loans, credit enhancement, or any other appropriate form of loan-related assistance.
