A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to academic achievement in public schools.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 21, Education Code, is
- 5 amended by adding Section 21.005 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 21.005. HIGH-QUALITY TEACHERS. The commissioner may
- 7 by rule establish a statewide standard to be used to certify each
- 8 school district that is preparing, training, and recruiting
- 9 high-quality teachers in a manner consistent with the No Child Left
- 10 Behind Act of 2001 (Pub. L. No. 107-110).
- 11 SECTION 2. Subchapter Z, Chapter 29, Education Code, is
- 12 amended by adding Section 29.908 to read as follows:
- Sec. 29.908. PROGRAMS OF MUTUAL BENEFIT. (a) The
- 14 commissioner, in coordination with appropriate representatives of
- 15 institutions of higher education and school districts, shall
- 16 develop:
- 17 (1) a diagnostic and assistance program for each
- 18 <u>subject assessed by an assessment instrument under Section</u>
- 19 39.023(c); and
- 20 <u>(2) other academic programs of mutual benefit to</u>
- 21 school districts and institutions of higher education.
- 22 (b) The commissioner shall seek private funding to make
- 23 available and maintain on the Internet each diagnostic and
- 24 assistance program developed under Subsection (a)(1).

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- 1 SECTION 3. Section 39.131(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 2 read as follows:
- 3 (b) If a campus performance is below any standard under
- 4 Section 39.073(b), the campus is considered a low-performing
- 5 campus. The [and the] commissioner may permit the campus to
- 6 participate in an innovative redesign of the campus to improve
- 7 campus performance or may take any of the other following actions,
- 8 listed in order of severity, to the extent the commissioner
- 9 determines necessary:
- 10 (1) issue public notice of the deficiency to the board
- 11 of trustees;
- 12 (2) order a hearing conducted by the board of trustees
- 13 at the campus for the purpose of notifying the public of the
- 14 unacceptable performance, the improvements in performance expected
- 15 by the agency, and the sanctions that may be imposed under this
- 16 section if the performance does not improve within a designated
- 17 period of time and of soliciting public comment on the initial steps
- 18 being taken to improve performance;
- 19 (3) order the preparation of a report regarding the
- 20 parental involvement program at the campus and a plan describing
- 21 strategies for improving parental involvement at the campus;
- 22 (4) order the preparation of a report regarding the
- 23 effectiveness of the district- and campus-level planning and
- 24 decision-making committees established under Subchapter F, Chapter
- 25 11, and a plan describing strategies for improving the
- 26 effectiveness of those committees;
- 27 (5) order the preparation of a student achievement

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- 1 improvement plan that addresses each academic excellence indicator
- 2 for which the campus's performance is unacceptable, the submission
- 3 of the plan to the commissioner for approval, and implementation of
- 4 the plan;
- 5 (6) order a hearing to be held before the commissioner
- 6 or the commissioner's designee at which the president of the board
- 7 of trustees, the superintendent, and the campus principal shall
- 8 appear and explain the campus's low performance, lack of
- 9 improvement, and plans for improvement;
- 10 (7) appoint a special campus intervention team to:
- 11 (A) conduct a comprehensive on-site evaluation
- 12 of each low-performing campus to determine the cause for the
- 13 campus's low performance and lack of progress;
- 14 (B) recommend actions, including reallocation of
- 15 resources and technical assistance, changes in school procedures or
- operations, staff development for instructional and administrative
- 17 staff, intervention for individual administrators or teachers,
- 18 waivers from state statute or rule, or other actions the team
- 19 considers appropriate;
- 20 (C) assist in the development of a campus plan
- 21 for student achievement; and
- (D) assist the commissioner in monitoring the
- 23 progress of the campus in implementing the campus plan for
- 24 improvement of student achievement;
- 25 (8) if a campus has been a low-performing campus for a
- 26 period of one year or more, appoint a board of managers composed of
- 27 residents of the district to exercise the powers and duties of the

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- 1 board of trustees of the district in relation to the campus; or
- 2 (9) if a campus has been a low-performing campus for a
- 3 period of two years or more, order closure of the school program on
- 4 the campus.
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act applies beginning with the 2003-2004
- 6 school year, except that the commissioner of education shall make
- 7 available not later than the beginning of the 2004-2005 school year
- 8 the programs developed under Section 29.908(a)(1), Education Code,
- 9 as added by this Act.
- 10 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
