## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the regulation of barbers and related occupations,
- 3 barbershops and specialty shops, and barber schools; providing a
- 4 criminal penalty.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 1601.051(b), Occupations Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (b) One member appointed under Subsection (a)(1) must be a
- 9 resident of a county with a population of  $75,000 \left[ \frac{25,000}{} \right]$  or less.
- 10 SECTION 2. Section 1601.253(b), Occupations Code, is
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- 12 (b) The board shall issue a Class A barber certificate to an
- 13 applicant who:
- 14 (1) complies with the application requirements of this
- 15 chapter;
- 16 (2) passes the examination with an average grade of at
- 17 least 75 percent;
- 18 (3) pays a fee set by board rule [not to exceed \$100];
- 19 and
- 20 (4) possesses the other qualifications required by
- 21 this chapter.
- SECTION 3. Sections 1601.254(a) and (c), Occupations Code,
- 23 are amended to read as follows:
- 24 (a) An applicant for a teacher's certificate must:

- 1 (1) be a Class A barber;
- 2 (2) have at least five years' experience as a
- 3 practicing barber in a barbershop, two years of which occurred in
- 4 the two years preceding the application date; and
- 5 (3) submit an examination fee set by board rule [not to
- 6 exceed \$100] with the application.
- 7 (c) The board shall issue a teacher's certificate to an
- 8 applicant who:
  - (1) passes the appropriate examination; and
- 10 (2) pays a certificate fee set by board rule [not to
- 11 exceed:

- 12 [(A) \$100, if the applicant fulfills the
- 13 certificate requirements during the period beginning November 1 of
- 14 an odd-numbered year and extending through October 31 of the
- 15 following year; or
- [(B) \$50, if the applicant fulfills the
- 17 certificate requirements during the period beginning November 1 of
- 18 an even-numbered year and extending through October 31 of the
- 19 <u>following year</u>].
- SECTION 4. Sections 1601.256(b) and (d), Occupations Code,
- 21 are amended to read as follows:
- 22 (b) An applicant for a barber technician license must:
- 23 (1) be at least 16 years of age;
- 24 (2) have completed the seventh grade or the equivalent
- of the seventh grade;
- 26 (3) have completed a course of instruction in a
- 27 board-approved training program consisting of not less than 300

- 1 hours in a period of not less than eight weeks; and
- 2 (4) submit a [\$10 administration] fee set by board
- 3 rule with the application.
- 4 (d) The board shall issue a barber technician license to an
- 5 applicant who:
- 6 (1) possesses the qualifications described by
- 7 Subsection (b);
- 8 (2) passes the appropriate examination;
- 9 (3) pays a license fee set by the board [not to exceed
- 10  $\frac{$100}{}$ ; and
- 11 (4) has not committed an act that is a ground for
- 12 denial of a license.
- SECTION 5. Sections 1601.257(b) and (c), Occupations Code,
- 14 are amended to read as follows:
- 15 (b) An applicant for a manicurist license must:
- 16 (1) be at least  $\underline{17}$  [ $\underline{16}$ ] years of age;
- 17 (2) have completed the seventh grade or the equivalent
- 18 of the seventh grade;
- 19 (3) have completed a board-approved training program
- 20 consisting of 600 hours of instruction in manicuring; and
- 21 (4) submit a [\$\frac{\$10 administration}{}] fee <a href="set by board">set by board</a>
- 22 rule with the application.
- (c) The board shall issue a manicurist license to an
- 24 applicant who:
- 25 (1) possesses the qualifications described by
- 26 Subsection (b);
- 27 (2) passes the appropriate examination;

- 1 (3) pays a license fee set by board rule [not to exceed
- $2 \frac{$30}{}$ ; and
- 3 (4) has not committed an act that is a ground for
- 4 denial of a license.
- 5 SECTION 6. Section 1601.260, Occupations Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 1601.260. ELIGIBILITY FOR STUDENT PERMIT. (a) An
- 8 applicant for a permit to be a student in a barber school must:
- 9 (1) submit an enrollment application to the board in
- 10 the form prescribed by the board;
- 11 (2) have completed the seventh grade;
- 12 (3) satisfy other requirements specified by the board;
- 13 and
- 14 (4) submit with the application a nonrefundable
- application fee set by board rule [in an amount not to exceed \$25].
- 16 (b) A separate application is required for each enrollment,
- 17 reenrollment, or transfer enrollment. The application fee applies
- only to the first enrollment. The board may [not] charge a separate
- 19 [the application] fee set by board rule for any later enrollment,
- 20 reenrollment, or transfer enrollment.
- 21 SECTION 7. Section 1601.261(b), Occupations Code, is
- 22 amended to read as follows:
- 23 (b) The board by rule shall set the fee for an examination
- 24 necessary to receive a certificate to practice barbering or to
- 25 practice as a barber technician or a manicurist [in an amount not to
- $26 \frac{\text{exceed } \$50}{\text{exceed }}$ ].
- 27 SECTION 8. Section 1601.266, Occupations Code, is amended

- 1 to read as follows:
- 2 Sec. 1601.266. DUPLICATE CERTIFICATE. The board may issue
- 3 a duplicate certificate on written application of the certificate
- 4 holder and payment of a fee set by board rule [not to exceed \$10].
- 5 SECTION 9. Section 1601.301, Occupations Code, is amended
- 6 by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsections (c) and (d) to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (b) A person who owns, operates, or manages a barbershop or
- 9 specialty shop must, not later than the third day after the date on
- 10 which the shop opens for business, [+
- 11  $\left[\frac{(1)}{2}\right]$  submit an application to the board for an
- 12 appropriate permit for the [each] shop, accompanied by the
- application fee set by board rule[; and
- 14 [(2) register with the board the person's full name and
- 15 the location of each shop].
- 16 (c) The application must provide:
- 17 (1) the permanent address of the barbershop or
- 18 specialty shop;
- 19 (2) the legal description of the premises to be
- 20 licensed;
- 21 (3) the person's full name; and
- 22 (4) any other information required by the board.
- 23 (d) A person operating under a barbershop permit or
- 24 specialty shop permit may not move the operation to another
- 25 location without submitting a new application to the board,
- 26 accompanied by the application fee set by board rule.
- 27 SECTION 10. Section 1601.303, Occupations Code, is amended

- 1 to read as follows:
- 2 Sec. 1601.303. ISSUANCE OF BARBERSHOP PERMIT. (a) The
- 3 board shall issue a barbershop permit to an applicant if:
- 4 (1) the applicant holds a Class A barber certificate
- 5 and is an owner of the shop or is practicing barbering at the shop;
- 6 [(2) the applicant has practiced barbering for at
- 7 least 12 months; and
- 8 (2)  $[\frac{(3)}{(3)}]$  the shop meets the minimum health standards
- 9 for barbershops set by the board and all other rules of the board.
- 10 (b) If a barber is not the owner of the barbershop, the shop
- owner's name must also appear on the barbershop permit.
- 12 SECTION 11. Section 1601.304(b), Occupations Code, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 (b) An applicant for a manicurist specialty shop permit must
- 15 submit:
- 16 (1) an application that includes:
- 17 (A) the shop's address;
- 18 (B) the legal description of the premises for
- 19 which the permit is sought; and
- 20 (C) any other information required by the board;
- 21 and
- 22 (2) an inspection fee in an amount <u>set by board rule</u>
- 23 [not to exceed \$50].
- SECTION 12. Section 1601.353(b), Occupations Code, is
- amended to read as follows:
- 26 (b) An applicant for a barber school permit must submit to
- 27 the board:

- 1 (1) a detailed drawing and chart of the proposed
- 2 physical layout of the school, showing the departments, floor
- 3 space, equipment, lights, and outlets;
- 4 (2) photographs of the proposed site for the school,
- 5 including the interior and exterior of the building, rooms, and
- 6 departments;
- 7 (3) a detailed copy of the training program;
- 8 (4) a copy of the catalogue and promotional literature
- 9 of the school;
- 10 (5) a copy of the building lease or proposed building
- 11 lease if the building is not owned by the school;
- 12 (6) a sworn statement showing the ownership of the
- 13 school; and
- 14 (7) a permit fee set by board rule [not to exceed
- 15 <del>\$1,000</del>].
- SECTION 13. Section 1601.356(b), Occupations Code, is
- 17 amended to read as follows:
- 18 (b) A barber school that is not approved by the board on
- 19 initial inspection may be reinspected. The board shall charge a
- 20 reinspection fee in an amount set by board rule [not to exceed
- 21 \$500].
- SECTION 14. Section 1601.402(c), Occupations Code, is
- 23 amended to read as follows:
- (c) The board shall issue a renewal certificate or license
- on receipt of a renewal application in the form prescribed by the
- 26 board, accompanied by a renewal fee in an amount set by board rule
- 27 [equal to the original certificate or license fee but not to exceed

- 1 \$100].
- 2 SECTION 15. Section 1601.403, Occupations Code, is amended
- 3 to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 1601.403. RENEWAL OF TEACHER'S CERTIFICATE. The board
- 5 shall renew a teacher's certificate biennially on or before
- 6 November 1 of each odd-numbered year on payment of a renewal fee set
- 7 by board rule [not to exceed \$100].
- 8 SECTION 16. Sections 1601.404(b) and (c), Occupations Code,
- 9 are amended to read as follows:
- 10 (b) A Class A barber or license holder whose certificate or
- 11 license has been expired for not more than five years may reinstate
- 12 the person's certificate or license by applying to the board and
- 13 submitting a personal affidavit that the board determines provides
- 14 a justification for issuing a certificate or license to the person.
- 15 The person must pay a fee set by board rule [equal to the amount of
- 16 the current certificate or license fee] and an additional
- delinquency fee set by board rule [of \$30] for each year or part of a
- 18 year the certificate or license has been expired.
- 19 (c) A Class A barber or license holder who retires from
- 20 practice and whose certificate or license has been expired for more
- 21 than five years may qualify for a new certificate or license by
- 22 applying to the board and by:
- 23 (1) making a proper showing to the board, supported by
- 24 a personal affidavit;
- 25 (2) paying an examination fee set by board rule [not to
- 26 exceed \$100];
- 27 (3) passing a satisfactory examination conducted by

- 1 the board; and
- 2 (4) paying the fee for an original certificate or
- 3 license.
- 4 SECTION 17. Section 1601.405(b), Occupations Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (b) The board shall issue a renewal certificate or license
- 7 on application and payment of the current [a] renewal fee not later
- 8 than the 90th day after the date the person is released or
- 9 discharged from active duty in the armed forces. [The renewal fee
- 10 <del>is:</del>
- 11 [(1) \$10 if the application and payment are made
- 12 during the period beginning November 1 of an odd-numbered year and
- 13 ending October 31 of the following year; or
- 14 [(2) \$5 if the application and payment are made during
- 15 the period beginning November 1 of an even-numbered year and ending
- 16 October 31 of the following year.
- 17 SECTION 18. Section 1601.406, Occupations Code, is amended
- 18 to read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 1601.406. RENEWAL OF BARBERSHOP OR SPECIALTY SHOP
- 20 PERMIT.
- 21 (a) A barbershop permit or specialty shop permit expires on
- 22 the second anniversary of the date of issuance of the permit [July 1
- 23 of each odd-numbered year].
- (b) A barbershop permit holder may renew the permit by
- 25 paying a renewal fee set by board rule [not to exceed \$70].
- 26 (c) A specialty shop permit holder may renew the permit by
- 27 submitting to the board a renewal application accompanied by a

- 1 renewal fee set by board rule [not to exceed \$50].
- 2 SECTION 19. Section 1601.407(b), Occupations Code, is
- 3 amended to read as follows:
- 4 (b) A barber school may renew its permit by paying a renewal
- 5 fee set by board rule [not to exceed \$300].
- 6 SECTION 20. Section 1601.408, Occupations Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 1601.408. RENEWAL OF EXPIRED PERMIT. A person holding
- 9 a barbershop, specialty shop, or barber school permit that has been
- 10 expired for more than 30 days may renew the person's permit by
- 11 submitting to the board a renewal application accompanied by:
- 12 (1) the regular renewal fee; and
- 13 (2) an additional delinquency fee set by board rule
- 14 [of \$30] for each year or part of a year the permit has been expired.
- SECTION 21. Subchapter I, Chapter 1601, Occupations Code,
- is amended by adding Section 1601.409 to read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 1601.409. CONTINUING EDUCATION. The board may
- 18 recognize, prepare, or administer continuing education programs
- 19 for the practice of barbering. Participation in the programs is
- 20 voluntary.
- 21 SECTION 22. Section 1601.501, Occupations Code, is amended
- 22 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1601.501. DISPLAY OF BARBERSHOP OR SPECIALTY SHOP
- 24 PERMIT. The holder of a [A] barbershop permit or specialty shop
- 25 permit [holder] must display the permit in a conspicuous place in
- 26 the shop for which the permit is issued.
- 27 SECTION 23. Section 1601.506, Occupations Code, is amended

1 to read as follows: Sec. 1601.506. CLEANLINESS. The board by rule shall adopt 2 reasonable standards for cleanliness applicable to each holder of a 3 license or permit under this chapter [(a) A person in charge of a 4 barbershop or specialty shop shall: 5 [(1) keep the shop and all furniture, tools, 6 appliances, and other equipment used at the shop in a clean 7 condition; 8 [(2) wash thoroughly, at least once daily, and 9 otherwise maintain the cleanliness of each comb, hairbrush, or 10 similar item used in the shop; and 11 [(3) sterilize, at least once after each use, each 12 mug, shaving brush, razor, scissors, shears, clippers, or tweezers 13 14 used in the shop]. [(b) A barber or other person regulated under this chapter 15 16 shall immediately after using: 17 [(1) a mug, shaving brush, or clippers for the service of a person, sterilize the equipment by immersing it in boiling 18 water for at least one minute; or 19 [(2) a razor or scissors, shears, or tweezers for the 20 service of a person, sterilize the equipment by: 21 22 [(A) immersing it for at least 10 minutes in a five percent aqueous solution of carbolic acid; or 23 24 [(B) immersing it in boiling water for at least 25 one minute. 26 [(c) A barber or other person regulated under this chapter may not: 27

1	[(1) use for the service of a customer:
2	[(A) a comb or hairbrush or any similar item that
3	is not thoroughly clean;
4	[ <del>(B) a mug, shaving brush, or razor or shears,</del>
5	scissors, clippers, or tweezers that are not thoroughly clean or
6	that have not been sterilized since last used; or
7	[(C) a towel or washcloth that has not been
8	laundered since last used;
9	[(2) serve a customer unless the person thoroughly
10	cleans the person's hands immediately before the service;
11	[(3) use on more than one person the same piece of alum
12	or other material to stop the flow of blood;
13	[(4) shave a person when the surface to be shaved is
14	inflamed, is broken out, or contains pus;
15	[ <del>(5)</del> permit any person to use the headrest of any
16	barber's chair under the person's control until after the headrest
17	has been covered with a towel that has been laundered since last
18	used or with clean new paper or a similar clean substance;
19	[ <del>(6)</del> use a powder puff or sponge in the service of a
20	customer unless it has been sterilized since last used;
21	[(7) use a finger bowl unless it has been sterilized
22	since last used and fresh water or other liquid has been placed in
23	the bowl; or
24	[ <del>(8)</del> serve a customer without the use of a sanitized
25	neck strip, cloth towel, or paper towel between the customer and the
26	chair cloth.
27	[ <del>(d) A person subject to Subsection (c) may use a neck</del>

## 1 duster in providing services for a customer.

- 2 SECTION 24. Section 1601.560(a), Occupations Code, is
- 3 amended to read as follows:
- 4 (a) In addition to the teacher required by Section
- 5 1601.355(b), a barber school that provides training leading to
- 6 issuance of a Class A barber certificate shall have at least one
- 7 qualified instructor, holding a Class A certificate, for every 25
- 8 [20] students on the premises [for instruction in practical work].
- 9 A teacher may serve as an instructor in practical work in addition
- 10 to holding a position as a theory teacher.
- SECTION 25. Sections 1601.651(a) and (b), Occupations Code,
- 12 are amended to read as follows:
- 13 (a) The attorney general may file an action for an
- 14 injunction or other proceeding to:
- 15 (1) enforce this chapter; or
- 16 (2) enjoin a barber, barbershop owner, or barber
- 17 school from operating in violation of this chapter.
- (b) A barber, barbershop owner, or barber school that
- 19 operates in violation of this chapter is liable to the state for a
- 20 civil penalty in the amount of \$25 a day for each day a violation
- 21 occurs. The attorney general may bring an action under this
- 22 subsection. The attorney general shall bring an action under this
- 23 subsection in Travis County.
- SECTION 26. Subchapter N, Chapter 1601, Occupations Code,
- is amended by adding Section 1601.652 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1601.652. CRIMINAL PENALTY. (a) A person commits an
- offense if the person violates this chapter or a rule adopted under

- 1 this chapter.
- 2 (b) An offense under this section is a misdemeanor
- 3 punishable by a fine of not less than \$100 or more than \$300.
- 4 SECTION 27. Section 1601.705(a), Occupations Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (a) If the person requests a hearing [or fails to respond in
- 7 a timely manner to the notice], the executive director shall set a
- 8 hearing and give written notice of the hearing to the person. An
- 9 administrative law judge of the State Office of Administrative
- 10 Hearings shall hold the hearing.
- 11 SECTION 28. Sections 1601.264, 1601.302, 1601.310,
- 12 1601.311, 1601.402(d), and 1601.503, Occupations Code, are
- 13 repealed.
- 14 SECTION 29. Chapter 1601, Occupations Code, as amended by
- 15 this Act, applies only to a license or permit issued, or a fee
- 16 charged, by the State Board of Barber Examiners on or after the
- 17 effective date of this Act.
- 18 SECTION 30. This Act takes effect immediately if it
- 19 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 20 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 21 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
