- 3 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003, and 4 applies only to an action filed on or after the effective date of
- 5 this Act. An action filed before the effective date of this Act is
- 6 governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective date
- 7 of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
