A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to consideration of a bidder's principal place of business
- 3 in awarding certain municipal and school district contracts.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 271.905(b), Local Government Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) In purchasing under this title any real property, [or]
- 8 personal property that is not affixed to real property, or
- 9 services, if a local government receives one or more bids from a
- 10 bidder whose principal place of business is in the local government
- and whose bid is within $\underline{\text{five}}$ [three] percent of the lowest bid price
- 12 received by the local government from a bidder who is not a resident
- 13 of the local government, the local government may enter into a
- 14 contract with:
- 15 (1) the lowest bidder; or
- 16 (2) the bidder whose principal place of business is in
- 17 the local government if the governing body of the local government
- 18 determines, in writing, that the local bidder offers the local
- 19 government the best combination of contract price and additional
- 20 economic development opportunities for the local government
- 21 created by the contract award, including the employment of
- 22 residents of the local government and increased tax revenues to the
- 23 local government.
- SECTION 2. Section 44.031, Education Code, is amended by

- 1 adding Subsection (b-1) to read as follows:
- 2 (b-1) In awarding a contract using a method described under
- 3 <u>Subsection (a)(1) or (a)(2), a school</u> district may consider a
- 4 bidder's or offeror's principal place of business in the manner
- 5 provided by Section 271.905, Local Government Code.
- 6 SECTION 3. Section 44.033, Education Code, is amended by
- 7 amending Subsection (c) and adding Subsection (f) to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 (c) Before the district makes a purchase from a category of
- 10 personal property, the district must obtain written or telephone
- 11 price quotations from at least three vendors from the list for that
- 12 category. If fewer than three vendors are on the list, the district
- shall contact each vendor on the list. Whenever possible, telephone
- 14 quotes should be confirmed in writing by mail or facsimile. The
- 15 bidding records must be retained with the school's competitive
- 16 bidding records and are subject to audit. Except as provided by
- 17 Subsection (f), the [The] purchase shall be made from the lowest
- 18 responsible bidder.
- 19 (f) In awarding a contract under this section, a school
- 20 district may consider a bidder's principal place of business in the
- 21 manner provided by Section 271.905, Local Government Code.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003, and
- 23 applies only to a contract for which the initial notice soliciting
- 24 bids or proposals is given on or after that date. A contract for
- 25 which the initial notice soliciting bids or proposals is given
- 26 before September 1, 2003, is governed by the law in effect when the
- 27 initial notice is given, and the former law is continued in effect
