2	relating to the donation by political subdivisions of outdated or
3	surplus fire-protection and emergency services equipment to
4	certain fire departments.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Chapter 272, Local Government Code, is amended
7	by adding Section 272.005 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 272.005. DONATION OF OUTDATED OR SURPLUS
9	FIRE-PROTECTION AND EMERGENCY SERVICES EQUIPMENT. (a) In this
10	section, "fire-protection and emergency services equipment" means
11	equipment or supplies, including vehicles and other personal
12	property, related to fire-protection, fire-fighting, or emergency
13	services.
14	(b) A political subdivision may donate outdated or surplus
15	fire-protection and emergency services equipment to a fire
16	department described by Section 52i, Article III, Texas
17	<pre>Constitution, that:</pre>
18	(1) serves a rural area with a population of not more
19	than 20,000; or
20	(2) has an annual budget of less than \$75,000.
21	(c) For a period of not less than 15 days before the date of
22	donating fire-protection and emergency services equipment under

other law, a political subdivision must:

- 1 political subdivision an itemized list of the fire-protection and
- 2 emergency services equipment it plans to donate; or
- 3 (2) publish at least one time an itemized list of the
- 4 fire-protection and emergency services equipment it plans to donate
- 5 in at least three newspapers, the combined circulation of which
- 6 will give reasonable circulation throughout the state.
- 7 (d) During the 15-day period under Subsection (c), a
- 8 political subdivision shall allow the chief of an eligible fire
- 9 department under Subsection (b), or the chief's designee, to
- 10 conduct an in-person inspection of the fire-protection and
- 11 emergency services equipment.
- 12 (e) If a municipality plans to donate fire-protection and
- 13 emergency services equipment to an underdeveloped country and an
- 14 eligible fire department under Subsection (b) submits a written
- 15 request to the municipality for an item of that equipment not later
- than the fifth working day after the expiration of the 15-day period
- 17 under Subsection (c), the municipality may not donate the item to an
- 18 underdeveloped country and must:
- 19 (1) donate the item to the requesting eligible fire
- 20 department; or
- 21 (2) sell the item by public auction.
- 22 (f) If two or more eligible fire departments submit written
- 23 requests for the same item to a political subdivision, the
- 24 political subdivision shall donate the item to the requesting
- 25 eligible fire department with the greatest need, as determined by
- 26 the Texas Forest Service.
- 27 (g) A political subdivision may not donate to an eligible

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- 1 fire department under Subsection (b) more than two vehicles during
- 2 <u>an 18-month period.</u>
- 3 SECTION 2. The heading to Chapter 272, Local Government
- 4 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 5 SALE, [OR] LEASE, OR DONATION OF PROPERTY BY MUNICIPALITIES,
- 6 COUNTIES, AND CERTAIN OTHER LOCAL GOVERNMENTS
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect when the constitutional
- 8 amendment proposed by the 78th Legislature, Regular Session, 2003,
- 9 authorizing political subdivisions to donate outdated or surplus
- 10 fire-protection and emergency services equipment to certain fire
- 11 departments is approved by the voters. If that proposed
- 12 constitutional amendment is not approved by the voters, this Act
- 13 has no effect.
