A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the creation of a council and an account in the general
3	revenue fund to help improve statewide public safety wireless
4	communication capabilities and enhance the Texas driver's license
5	system.
6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
7	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 411, Government Code, is
8	amended by adding Sections 411.0105 and 411.0106 to read as
9	follows:

- 10 <u>Sec. 411.0105. PUBLIC SAFETY WIRELESS COMMUNICATIONS</u>
 11 COUNCIL. (a) In this <u>section:</u>
- 12 (1) "Public safety spectrum" means any radio frequency

 13 spectrum administered by the Federal Communications Commission

 14 under 47 C.F.R. Section 90 for operation of interoperable and

 15 general-use radio communications systems for public safety

 16 purposes in the state.
- 17 (2) "Infrastructure equipment" means the underlying
 18 permanent equipment required for wireless communications systems
 19 that are designed to facilitate public safety wireless
 20 communications interoperability.
- 21 <u>(b) The Public Safety Wireless Communications Council is</u>
 22 <u>composed of the administrative head of each of the following</u>
 23 entities or that person's designee:
- 24 (1) the department;

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1	(2) Texas Department of Transportation;
2	(3) Texas Department of Criminal Justice;
3	(4) Parks and Wildlife Department;
4	(5) Texas Forest Service;
5	(6) Texas Youth Commission;
6	(7) Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission; and
7	(8) Sheriffs' Association of Texas.
8	(c) The council shall:
9	(1) advise the department in the development and
10	administration of a strategic plan to implement statewide
11	integrated public safety wireless communications systems for state
12	agencies, political subdivisions of the state, and volunteer fire
13	departments that promote interoperability and other shared uses of
14	the public safety spectrum within and between local, state, and
15	federal agencies and that is consistent with the regulations and
16	decisions of the Federal Communications Commission;
17	(2) develop a model memorandum of understanding that
18	sets forth the general terms of agreement for interoperability and
19	other shared uses of the public safety spectrum and infrastructure
20	between a state agency and a local or federal agency;
21	(3) research and identify the wireless communications
22	infrastructure equipment necessary to improve interoperability and
23	other shared uses of the public safety spectrum in order to
24	facilitate the strategic plan under Subdivision (1);
25	(4) research and identify state agencies that need new
26	or upgraded wireless communications equipment to be capable of
27	participating in interoperability and other shared uses of the

- 1 public safety spectrum within and between local, state, and federal 2 agencies; 3 (5) advise the department in the development and 4 administration of a program to purchase wireless communications equipment in order to facilitate the strategic plan under 5 6 Subdivision (1); (6) develop specific agreements for interoperability 7 8 and other shared uses of the public safety spectrum between local, 9 state, and federal agencies that operate wireless systems on the 10 public safety spectrum and that have the capability for interoperability or other shared uses; and 11 (7) research and identify any enhancements to the 12 Texas driver's license system that are necessary to facilitate the 13 14 strategic plan under Subdivision (1). 15 (d) In developing specific agreements under Subsection 16 (c)(6), the council must seek assistance and relevant information

- 6 the council and assist with the preparation of a report required by

- 8 Sec. 411.0106. PUBLIC SAFETY WIRELESS COMMUNICATIONS AND
- 9 DRIVER'S LICENSE SYSTEM IMPROVEMENT FUND. (a) The public safety
- 10 wireless communications and driver's license system improvement
- 11 fund is an account in the general revenue fund.
- 12 (b) Section 403.095 does not apply to the fund.
- 13 (c) The fund is financed by:
- 14 (1) an additional fee on each driver's license
- 15 <u>issuance</u> and renewal as prescribed by Section 521.421,
- 16 <u>Transportation Code; and</u>
- 17 (2) any federal money, including grants and
- 18 appropriations, sent to the state and dedicated for homeland
- 19 security wireless communications purposes.
- 20 (d) Money in the fund may only be appropriated to and used by
- 21 the department in accordance with this section and Section 411.0105
- 22 <u>to:</u>
- 23 <u>(1) re-engineer and otherwise enhance the Texas</u>
- 24 driver's license system to help prevent identity fraud, improve
- 25 <u>information storage and retrieval capabilities</u>, promote rapid
- 26 <u>dissemination of information</u>, and help facilitate statewide
- 27 interoperable wireless communications systems;

- 1 (2) maintain and support an enhanced driver's license
- 2 system;
- 3 (3) design statewide interoperable wireless
- 4 communications systems;
- 5 (4) purchase new or upgraded wireless communications
- 6 infrastructure equipment to enable local, state, and federal
- 7 agencies to be capable of participating in interoperability and
- 8 other shared uses of the public safety spectrum and to facilitate
- 9 statewide interoperable wireless communications systems; and
- 10 (5) reimburse state agencies for the costs of
- 11 operating and maintaining telecommunications equipment and
- 12 participating in interoperability and other shared uses of the
- 13 public safety spectrum within and between local, state, and federal
- 14 agencies.
- SECTION 2. Section 521.421, Transportation Code, is amended
- 16 by amending Subsections (a) and (b) and adding Subsection (i) to
- 17 read as follows:
- 18 (a) The fee for issuance or renewal of a license not
- otherwise provided for by this section is $\frac{$36}{}$ [\$24].
- 20 (b) The fee for renewal of a Class M license or for renewal
- of a license that includes authorization to operate a motorcycle is
- 22 \$44 [\$32].
- 23 (i) The department shall remit \$12 from each fee collected
- 24 by the issuance or renewal of a license under Subsections (a) and
- 25 (b) to the comptroller for deposit in the public safety wireless
- 26 <u>communications and driver's license system improvement fund</u>
- 27 account subject to Section 411.0106, Government Code.

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- 1 SECTION 3. (a) The Public Safety Wireless Communications
- 2 Council created by Section 411.0105, Government Code, as added by
- 3 this Act:
- 4 (1) shall hold its first meeting in accordance with
- 5 that section not later than December 1, 2003; and
- 6 (2) shall provide to the legislature its first report
- 7 required under that section not later than September 1, 2004.
- 8 (b) In addition to information about the progress of its
- 9 duties and functions, the first report must include information
- 10 about the steps necessary and projected costs for implementation
- and maintenance of statewide interoperable wireless communications
- 12 systems to facilitate the strategic plan under Section 411.0105(c),
- 13 Government Code, as added by this Act.
- 14 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
