5	ARTICLE 1. TEXAS SCHOOL EMPLOYEES UNIFORM GROUP HEALTH COVERAGE
6	ACT AND BENEFITS FOR SCHOOL EMPLOYEES
7	SECTION 1.01. Section 3, Article 3.50-7, Insurance Code, is
8	amended by adding Subsection (g) to read as follows:
9	(g) The trustee shall provide the group health coverage plan
10	under this article through a defined contribution plan. The
11	trustee may provide optional coverages offered under the program
12	through the defined contribution plan. The trustee shall adopt
13	rules as necessary to implement this subsection.
14	SECTION 1.02. Section 2(c), Article 3.50-8, Insurance Code,
15	is amended to read as follows:
16	(c) The trustee shall distribute funds under this article in
17	equal <u>annual</u> [monthly] installments. The trustee is entitled to
18	recover from a school district, other educational district,
19	participating charter school, or regional education service center
20	any amount distributed under this article to which the district,
21	school, or service center was not entitled.
22	SECTION 1.03. Section 2(c), Article 3.50-9, Insurance Code,
23	is amended to read as follows:
24	(c) Amounts used as required by this section shall be

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deposited, as applicable, in [+ 1 2 [(1)]the Texas school employees uniform group coverage trust fund established under Section 8, Article 3.50-7, of 3 4 this code[; or [(2) another fund established for the payment of 5 6 employee health coverage that meets requirements for those funds 7 prescribed by the Texas Education Agency]. SECTION 1.04. Section 22.004(h), Education Code, is amended 8 to read as follows: 9 An audited financial statement provided under this 10 (h) section must be made in accordance with rules adopted by the board 11 of trustees of the Teacher Retirement System of Texas [commissioner 12 of insurance or state auditor, as applicable]. 13 ARTICLE 2. TEXAS PUBLIC SCHOOL EMPLOYEES GROUP BENEFITS ACT 14 15 SECTION 2.01. Section 1575.003(1), Insurance Code, as effective June 1, 2003, is amended to read as follows: 16 17 (1)"Dependent" means: the spouse of a retiree or active employee; (A) 18 an unmarried child of a retiree, active 19 (B) employee, or deceased active employee if the child is younger than 20 21 <u>19</u> [25] years of age, including: (i) an adopted child; 22 (ii) a foster child, stepchild, or other 23 24 child who is in a regular parent-child relationship; or 25 (iii) a recognized natural child; (C) a retiree's or active employee's recognized 26 natural child, adopted child, foster child, stepchild, or other 27

child, without regard to the age of the child, if the child is in a regular parent-child relationship, lives with or has the child's care provided by the retiree, active employee, or surviving spouse on a regular basis, and is mentally retarded or physically incapacitated to an extent that the child is dependent on the retiree, active employee, or surviving spouse for care or support, as determined by the board of trustees; or

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8 (D) a deceased active employee's recognized 9 natural child, adopted child, foster child, stepchild, or other 10 child who is in a regular parent-child relationship, without regard 11 to the age of the child, if, while the active employee was alive, 12 the child:

13 (i) lived with or had the child's care14 provided by the active employee on a regular basis; and

(ii) was mentally retarded or physically incapacitated to an extent that the child was dependent on the active employee or surviving spouse for care or support, as determined by the board of trustees.

SECTION 2.02. Section 1575.159, Insurance Code, as
effective June 1, 2003, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 1575.159. COVERAGE FOR PROSTATE-SPECIFIC ANTIGEN TEST. A health benefit plan offered under the group program must provide coverage for a medically accepted prostate-specific antigen test used for the detection of prostate cancer for each male enrolled in the plan who:

26 (1) is at least <u>55</u> [50] years of age; or
27 (2) is at least <u>35</u> [40] years of age and:

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1 (A) has a family history of prostate cancer; or exhibits another cancer risk factor. 2 (B) SECTION 2.03. Section 1575.202(a), Insurance Code, 3 as 4 effective June 1, 2003, is amended to read as follows: 5 (a) Each state fiscal year, the state shall contribute to 6 the fund an amount equal to 0.1 [0.5] percent of the salary of each 7 active employee. 8 SECTION 2.04. Section 1575.203(a), Insurance Code, as effective June 1, 2003, is amended to read as follows: 9 (a) Each state fiscal year, each active employee shall, as a 10 condition of employment, contribute to the fund an amount equal to 11 0.5 [0.25] percent of the employee's salary. 12 SECTION 2.05. Section 1575.204, Insurance 13 Code, as effective June 1, 2003, is repealed. 14 15 SECTION 2.06. Section 1577.101, Insurance Code, as 16 effective June 1, 2003, is amended to read as follows: Sec. 1577.101. CONTRACTS TO PROVIDE COVERAGES. The board of 17 trustees may [shall] contract with one or more carriers authorized 18 to provide the applicable type of insurance to provide each type of 19 coverage required by Subchapter B. 20 ARTICLE 3. EFFECTIVE DATE 21 22 SECTION 3.01. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
