A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT
relating to the Texas Water Advisory Council.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
SECTION 1. Section 9.008(a), Water Code, is amended to read
as follows:
(a) The council shall:
(1) heighten the level of dialogue on significant
water policy issues and, in an advisory role only, strive to provide
focus and recommendations on state water policy [initiatives],
including:
(A) [promoting flexibility and incentives for]
water desalination, brush control, [regionalization,] weather
modification [ $\frac{projects}{}$ ], $\frac{reuse}{}$ , and public-private partnerships
relating to water projects;

- 15 (B) <u>infrastructure</u> improvement for water
- 16 projects [promoting adequate financing for surface water and
- 17 groundwater projects];
- 18 (C) [development of] water conservation and
- 19 drought management <u>practices</u> [projects];
- 20 (D) <u>status</u> [<u>implementation</u>] of [<u>approved</u>]
- 21 regional and state water plans;
- 22 (E) encouraging commonality of technical data
- 23 and information such as joint agency studies, freshwater inflow
- 24 recommendations, surface water and groundwater availability

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- 1 models, and bay and estuary and instream flow recommendations
- developed by the Parks and Wildlife Department, the commission, and
- 3 the Texas Water Development Board; [and]
- 4 (F) encouraging the use of supplemental
- 5 environmental projects for water infrastructure needs and
- 6 enhancing the aquatic environment and habitat in enforcement
- 7 proceedings at a state agency or political subdivision;
- 8 (G) water marketing, speculation, and region of
- 9 origin impacts; and
- 10 (H) environmental and instream flows;
- 11 (2) encourage the enhancement and coordination of
- 12 state, interstate, and international efforts to improve
- 13 environmental quality and living conditions along the Texas-Mexico
- 14 border;
- 15 (3) coordinate a unified state position on federal and
- 16 international water issues; and
- 17 (4) advise the Texas Water Development Board on
- developing criteria for prioritizing the funding of projects in the
- 19 state water plan.
- SECTION 2. Section 9.011(a), Water Code, is amended to read
- 21 as follows:
- 22 (a)  $\underline{\text{In}}$  [Before] its five-year analysis under Section 9.010,
- an authority shall report to the council a self-assessment of:
- 24 (1) how the authority is achieving its stated mission
- 25 and goals, including an identification of any barriers to achieving
- 26 the mission and goals;
- 27 (2) how the authority is providing service to its

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- 1 customers, including mechanisms the authority provides to
- 2 encourage input from the public and its customers;
- 3 (3) how the authority is addressing issues raised by
- 4 its most recent management audit, if the audit is required by
- 5 commission rule to be performed, including its administrative
- 6 policies; and
- 7 (4) the authority's role in the regional water
- 8 planning process.
- 9 SECTION 3. Section 9.017, Water Code, is amended to read as
- 10 follows:
- 11 Sec. 9.017. DISSOLUTION OF COUNCIL AND ACCOUNT. Unless
- extended by the 79th or 80th [78th] Texas Legislature, this chapter
- 13 and the interagency water advisory account expire on September 1,
- 14 2007 [2005].
- 15 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
