- Sec. 771.1071. WORK GROUP. (a) The presiding officer of

- 19 (b) A member of the work group receives no additional
- 20 compensation for serving on the work group and may not be reimbursed

- 25 SECTION 4. Section 771.108, Health and Safety Code, is
