A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the appointment of the Department of Protective and
- 3 Regulatory Services to serve as a temporary or permanent guardian
- 4 for a ward.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 48.209, Human Resources Code, is amended
- 7 by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsections (g) and (h) to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 (b) As a last resort, the department may apply to be
- 10 appointed guardian of the person or estate of an elderly or disabled
- 11 person who is found by the department to be in a state of abuse,
- 12 neglect, or exploitation, and who, because of a physical or mental
- 13 condition, will be substantially unable to provide food, clothing,
- or shelter for himself or herself, to care for the individual's own
- 15 physical health, or to manage the individual's own financial
- 16 affairs. A representative of the department shall take the oath
- 17 required by the Texas Probate Code on behalf of the department when
- 18 [if] the department begins to serve as [is appointed] guardian. If
- 19 the department knows that an individual is willing and able to serve
- 20 as the guardian, the department may inform the court of that
- 21 individual's willingness and ability.
- 22 (g) A court may not appoint the department as a guardian
- under Section 682 or 875, Texas Probate Code, unless:
- 24 (1) the department files an application for

- 1 appointment under Section 682 or 875, Texas Probate Code, as
- 2 appropriate;
- 3 (2) the proposed ward is an individual described by
- 4 Subsection (a) or (b); and
- 5 (3) the proposed ward has sufficient resources for
- 6 appropriate care or is eligible for Medicaid or another form of
- 7 public assistance for that care.
- 8 (h) Notwithstanding Subsection (g), a court, after serious
- 9 consideration and review, may appoint the department as a guardian
- 10 <u>under Section 682 or 875, Texas Probate Code, as a last resort only</u>
- 11 <u>if:</u>
- 12 (1) the proposed ward is an individual described by
- 13 Subsection (a) or (b); and
- 14 (2) there is no individual willing and able to serve as
- 15 the proposed ward's quardian.
- SECTION 2. Section 701, Texas Probate Code, is amended to
- 17 read as follows:
- 18 Sec. 701. TIME FOR TAKING OATH AND GIVING BOND. Except as
- 19 provided by Section 48.209(b), Human Resources Code, or Section
- 20 682A(a) of this code, the oath of a guardian may be taken and
- 21 subscribed, or the bond of a guardian may be given and approved, at
- 22 any time before the expiration of the 20th day after the date of the
- order granting letters of guardianship, or before the letters have
- 24 been revoked for a failure to qualify within the time allowed. An
- oath may be taken before any person authorized to administer oaths
- 26 under the laws of this state.
- 27 SECTION 3. Section 875, Texas Probate Code, is amended by

- 1 amending Subsection (j) and adding Subsection (l) to read as
- 2 follows:
- 3 (j) The court may not [customarily or ordinarily] appoint
- 4 the Department of Protective and Regulatory Services as a temporary
- 5 guardian under this section unless:
- 6 (1) the department files an application for
- 7 appointment as guardian under this section;
- 8 (2) the proposed ward is an individual described by
- 9 Section 48.209(a) or (b), Human Resources Code; and
- 10 (3) the proposed ward has sufficient resources for
- 11 appropriate care or is eligible for Medicaid or another form of
- 12 public assistance for that care. [The appointment of the
- 13 department as a temporary guardian under this section should be
- 14 made only as a last resort.
- 15 (1) Notwithstanding Subsection (j) of this section, a
- 16 court, after serious consideration and review, may appoint the
- 17 Department of Protective and Regulatory Services as a guardian
- 18 under this section as a last resort only if:
- 19 (1) the proposed ward is an individual described by
- 20 Section 48.209(a) or (b), Human Resources Code; and
- 21 (2) there is no individual willing and able to serve as
- the proposed ward's guardian.
- 23 SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act to Section
- 24 875, Texas Probate Code, and Section 48.209, Human Resources Code,
- 25 apply only to an application for the appointment of a guardian or
- 26 temporary guardian filed:
- 27 (1) on or after the effective date of this Act; or

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- 1 (2) before the effective date of this Act if the
- 2 proceeding is pending on the effective date of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 5. (a) The Department of Protective and Regulatory
- 4 Services shall conduct a study to identify distinct populations for
- 5 whom the department may appropriately provide guardianship
- 6 services.
- 7 (b) Not later than September 1, 2004, the Department of
- 8 Protective and Regulatory Services shall submit a report of the
- 9 study's findings to the legislature. The report must make a
- 10 recommendation regarding expansion of the department's
- 11 guardianship services based on the study's findings.
- 12 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
