A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to safety regulations for certain extracurricular school
3	activities.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 33, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter E to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER E. SAFETY REGULATIONS FOR CERTAIN EXTRACURRICULAR
8	<u>ACTIVITIES</u>
9	Sec. 33.101. APPLICABILITY. This subchapter applies to
10	each public school in this state and to any other school in this
11	state subject to University Interscholastic League regulations.
12	Sec. 33.102. SAFETY TRAINING REQUIRED. (a) The
13	commissioner by rule shall develop and adopt a safety training
14	program as provided by this section. In developing the program, the
15	commissioner may use materials available from the American Red
16	Cross or another appropriate entity.
17	(b) The following persons must satisfactorily complete the
18	safety training program:
19	(1) a coach, trainer, or sponsor for an
20	extracurricular athletic activity;
21	(2) except as provided by Subsection (f), a physician
22	who is employed by a school or school district or who volunteers to
23	assist with an extracurricular athletic activity; and
24	(3) a director responsible for a school marching band.

1	(c) The safety training program must include:
2	(1) certification of participants by the American Red
3	Cross, the American Heart Association, or a similar organization,
4	as determined by the commissioner;
5	(2) annual training in:
6	(A) emergency action planning;
7	(B) cardiopulmonary resuscitation if the person
8	is not required to obtain certification under Section 33.086;
9	(C) communicating effectively with 9-1-1
LO	emergency service operators and other emergency personnel; and
L1	(D) recognizing symptoms of potentially
L2	catastrophic injuries, including head and neck injuries,
L3	concussions, injuries related to second impact syndrome, asthma
L4	attacks, heatstroke, cardiac arrest, and injuries requiring use of
L5	a defibrillator; and
L6	(3) at least once each school year, a safety drill that
L7	incorporates the training described by Subdivision (2) and
L8	simulates various injuries described by Subdivision (2)(D).
L9	(d) A student participating in an extracurricular athletic
20	activity must receive training related to:
21	(1) recognizing the symptoms described by Subsection
22	(c)(2)(D); and
23	(2) the risks of using supplements designed or
24	marketed to enhance athletic performance.
25	(e) The safety training program and the training under
26	Subsection (d) may each be conducted by a school or school district
7	or by an expanigation described by Subsection (a)(1)

- 1 (f) A physician who is employed by a school or school 2 district or who volunteers to assist with an extracurricular
- 3 athletic activity is exempt from the requirements of Subsection (b)
- 4 if the physician attends a continuing medical education course that
- 5 specifically addresses emergency medicine for athletic team
- 6 physicians.
- 7 Sec. 33.103. RECOMMENDATION RELATED TO HEART SCREENING.
- 8 The University Interscholastic League shall recommend that each
- 9 student participating in an extracurricular athletic activity
- 10 receive a heart screening.
- Sec. 33.104. CERTAIN UNSAFE ATHLETIC ACTIVITIES
- 12 PROHIBITED. A coach, trainer, or sponsor for an extracurricular
- 13 athletic activity may not encourage or permit a student
- 14 participating in the activity to engage in any unreasonably
- 15 dangerous athletic technique that unnecessarily endangers the
- 16 health of a student, including using a helmet or any other sports
- 17 <u>equipment as a weapon.</u>
- 18 Sec. 33.105. CERTAIN SAFETY PRECAUTIONS REQUIRED. (a) A
- 19 coach, trainer, or sponsor for an extracurricular athletic activity
- 20 <u>shall at each athletic practice or competition ensure that:</u>
- 21 (1) each student participating in the activity is
- 22 adequately hydrated;
- 23 (2) any prescribed asthma medication for a student
- 24 participating in the activity is readily available to the student;
- 25 (3) if available at the school, a defibrillator is
- 26 readily accessible for use at the practice or competition;
- 27 (4) emergency lanes providing access to the practice

- 1 or competition area are open and clear; and
- 2 <u>(5) heatstroke prevention materials are readily</u>
- 3 available.
- 4 (b) A referee, umpire, or other official at an
- 5 <u>extracurricular athletic competition may prohibit a student from</u>
- 6 participating in the competition if:
- 7 (1) the official observes a violation of Subsection
- 8 <u>(a); or</u>
- 9 (2) the official determines that the removal would
- 10 likely prevent the death of or serious injury to the student.
- 11 (c) If a student participating in an extracurricular
- 12 athletic activity, including a practice or competition, is rendered
- 13 unconscious during the activity, the student may not:
- 14 (1) return to the practice or competition during which
- 15 the student was rendered unconscious; or
- 16 (2) continue to participate in any extracurricular
- 17 athletic activity until the student receives written authorization
- 18 from a physician.
- 19 Sec. 33.106. COMPLIANCE; ENFORCEMENT. (a) On request, a
- 20 school shall make available to the public proof of compliance for
- 21 each person enrolled in, employed by, or volunteering for the
- 22 school who is required to receive safety training described by
- 23 <u>Section 33.102.</u>
- 24 (b) The superintendent of a school district or the director
- of a school subject to this subchapter shall maintain complete and
- 26 accurate records of the district's or school's compliance with
- 27 Section 33.102.

- 1 (c) A school campus that is determined by the school's
- 2 superintendent or director to be in noncompliance with Section
- 3 33.102, 33.104, or 33.105 shall discontinue all extracurricular
- 4 athletic activities offered by the school campus, including all
- 5 practices and competitions, until the superintendent or director
- 6 determines that the school campus is in compliance.
- 7 Sec. 33.107. CONTACT INFORMATION. (a) The commissioner
- 8 shall maintain an existing telephone number and an electronic mail
- 9 address to allow a person to report a violation of this subchapter.
- 10 (b) Each school that offers an extracurricular athletic
- 11 activity shall prominently display at the administrative offices of
- 12 the school the telephone number and electronic mail address
- 13 maintained under Subsection (a).
- 14 Sec. 33.108. UNIVERSITY INTERSCHOLASTIC LEAGUE MEDICAL
- 15 ADVISORY BOARD SUBCOMMITTEE. (a) The director of the University
- 16 Interscholastic League shall appoint a subcommittee from among the
- 17 membership of the league's medical advisory board. The director or
- the director's designee shall serve as the subcommittee's presiding
- 19 officer.
- 20 (b) The subcommittee shall prepare a statement of the risks
- of injury resulting from participation in extracurricular athletic
- 22 <u>activities. The University Interscholastic League shall post the</u>
- 23 text of the statement on the league's Internet website and provide
- 24 to each student participating in an extracurricular athletic
- 25 activity and to the student's parent or guardian a copy of the
- 26 statement.
- Sec. 33.109. NOTICE REQUIRED. A school that offers an

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- 1 extracurricular athletic activity shall provide to each student
- 2 participating in an extracurricular athletic activity and to the
- 3 student's parent or guardian a copy of the text of Sections
- 4 33.101-33.108.
- 5 Sec. 33.110. INCORPORATION OF SAFETY REGULATIONS. The
- 6 University Interscholastic League shall incorporate the provisions
- 7 of Sections 33.103-33.108 into the league's constitution and
- 8 contest rules.
- 9 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003, and
- 10 applies beginning with the 2004-2005 school year, except that
- 11 Sections 33.104 and 33.108, Education Code, as added by this Act,
- 12 apply beginning with the 2003-2004 school year.
