A seller may 7 enforce the remedy of rescission or of forfeiture and acceleration 8 against a purchaser in default under an executory contract for 9 conveyance of real property only if: 10 (1) the seller notifies the purchaser of: 11 12 (A) the seller's intent to enforce a remedy under 13 this section; and 14 (B) the purchaser's right to cure the default 15 within the 30-day [60-day] period described by Section 5.065; (2) the purchaser fails to cure the default within the 16 30-day [60-day] period described by Section 5.065; and 17 (3) Section 5.066 does not apply. 18 19 SECTION 2. Section 5.065, Property Code, is amended to read as follows: 20 Sec. 5.065. RIGHT TO CURE DEFAULT. Notwithstanding an 21 22 agreement to the contrary, a purchaser in default under an 23 executory contract for the conveyance of real property may avoid the enforcement of a remedy described by Section 5.064 by complying 24

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S.B. No. 1527 1 with the terms of the contract on or before the <u>30th</u> [<del>60th</del>] day 2 after the date notice is given under that section.

3 SECTION 3. (a) This Act takes effect September 1, 2003. 4 (b) The change in law made by this Act applies only to an 5 executory contract for conveyance signed on or after September 1, 6 2003. An executory contract for conveyance signed before September 7 1, 2003, is covered by the law in effect when the contract was 8 signed, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
