- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 141, Health and Safety Code, is amended 6 by adding Section 141.0035 to read as follows:
- Sec. 141.0035. LICENSE FEES. The board by rule shall establish the amount of the fee for obtaining or renewing a license
- 9 under this chapter. The board shall set the fee in a reasonable
- 10 amount designed to recover the direct and indirect costs to the
- 11 department of administering and enforcing this chapter. The board
- 12 may set fees in a different amount for resident youth camps and day
- 13 youth camps to reflect differences in the costs of administering
- and enforcing this chapter for resident and day camps.
- SECTION 2. Section 141.004(a), Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 17 (a) To obtain a license, a person must submit a license
- 18 application accompanied by a license fee in an amount set by the
- 19 board [as follows:
- [(1) a resident youth camp shall pay a fee of \$40 for a
- 21 new license; and
- 22 [(2) a day youth camp shall pay a fee of \$25 for a new
- 23 license].

SECTION 3. Section 141.005(b), Health and Safety Code, is

- 1 amended to read as follows:
- 2 (b) The application must be accompanied by a renewal fee <u>in</u>
- 3 an amount set by the board [of:
- 4 [(1) \$40 for a resident camp; or
- $[\frac{(2) \quad \$25 \text{ for a day camp}}].$
- 6 SECTION 4. The Texas Board of Health shall adopt rules to
- 7 implement the change in law made by this Act as soon as practicable.
- 8 Until the board's rules take effect, the Texas Department of Health
- 9 shall continue to charge the amounts prescribed for a license fee
- 10 under Section 141.004 or 141.005, Health and Safety Code, as
- 11 applicable, as those sections existed immediately before the
- 12 effective date of this Act, and the prior law is continued in effect
- 13 for this purpose.
- SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
