A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 21.403, Labor Code, is amended by adding
- 6 Subsection (e) to read as follows:
- 7 (e) A person who discloses genetic information in violation
- 8 of this section is liable for a civil penalty of not more than
- 9 \$10,000. The attorney general may bring an action in the name of
- 10 the state to recover the penalty, plus reasonable attorney's fees
- 11 <u>and court costs.</u>
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 3, Article 9032, Revised Statutes, is
- amended by adding Subsection (e) to read as follows:
- (e) A person who discloses genetic information in violation
- of this section is liable for a civil penalty of not more than
- 16 \$10,000. The attorney general may bring an action in the name of
- 17 the state to recover the penalty, plus reasonable attorney's fees
- 18 and court costs.
- 19 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 20 to a disclosure of genetic information made on or after the
- 21 effective date of this Act. A disclosure of genetic information
- 22 made before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law as
- 23 it existed immediately before that date, and that law is continued
- 24 in effect for that purpose.

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
