A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the care of elementary and secondary school students
3	with diabetes.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 38, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter C to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER C. CARE OF STUDENTS WITH DIABETES
8	Sec. 38.101. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
9	(1) "Individual health plan" means the document
LO	required by Section 38.102.
L1	(2) "School" means a public elementary or secondary
L2	school.
L3	(3) "School employee" means a person employed by:
L4	<pre>(A) a school;</pre>
L5	(B) a local health department that assists a
L6	school under this subchapter; or
L7	(C) another entity with which a school has
L8	contracted to perform its duties under this subchapter.
L9	(4) "Trained diabetes care assistant" means a school
20	employee who has completed the training required by Section 38.103.
21	Sec. 38.102. INDIVIDUAL HEALTH PLAN. (a) An individual
22	health plan must be developed for each student with diabetes who
23	will seek care for the student's diabetes while at school. The plan
24	shall be developed by:

Τ	(1) the student's parent or guardian; and
2	(2) the student's personal health care team.
3	(b) An individual health plan must:
4	(1) identify the health care services the student may
5	receive at school; and
6	(2) be signed by the student's personal health care
7	team.
8	(c) The parent or guardian of a student with diabetes who
9	seeks care for the student's diabetes while the student is at school
10	shall submit to the school a copy of the student's individual health
11	plan. The plan must be submitted to and reviewed by the school:
12	(1) before the beginning of each school year;
13	(2) on enrollment of the student, if the student
14	enrolls in the school after the beginning of a school year; or
15	(3) as soon as practicable following a diagnosis of
16	diabetes for the student.
17	Sec. 38.103. TRAINED DIABETES CARE ASSISTANT. (a) The
18	Texas Diabetes Council shall develop, with the assistance of the
19	following entities, guidelines for the training of school employees
20	in the care of students with diabetes:
21	(1) the School Health Program of the Texas Department
22	of Health;
23	(2) the American Diabetes Association;
24	(3) the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation
25	<pre>International;</pre>
26	(4) the American Association of Diabetes Educators;
27	and

1	(5) the agency.
2	(b) A school employee is not required to be a health care
3	professional to be designated as a trained diabetes care assistant.
4	(c) If a school nurse is assigned to a campus:
5	(1) the school nurse must be one of the trained
6	diabetes care assistants at that campus; or
7	(2) the school nurse shall supervise other school
8	employees acting as trained diabetes care assistants.
9	(d) If a school nurse is not assigned to a campus, the
10	trained diabetes care assistant must have access, for emergency or
11	informational assistance, to an individual who has expertise in the
12	care of persons with diabetes, such as a physician, physician
13	assistant, registered nurse, certified diabetes educator, or
14	licensed dietitian.
15	(e) Training under this section must be provided annually by
16	a health care professional with expertise in the care of persons
17	with diabetes. The training must be provided before the beginning
18	of the school year or as soon as practicable following:
19	(1) the enrollment of a student with diabetes at a
20	campus that previously had no students with diabetes; or
21	(2) a diagnosis of diabetes for a student at a campus
22	that previously had no students with diabetes.
23	(f) The training must include instruction in:
24	(1) recognizing hypoglycemia and hyperglycemia;
25	(2) understanding the proper action to take if the
26	blood glucose levels of a student with diabetes are outside the
27	target ranges indicated by the student's individual health plan;

- 1 (3) understanding a physician's instructions
- 2 concerning diabetes medication dosages, administration, and
- 3 frequency of administration;
- 4 (4) performing finger-sticks to check blood glucose
- 5 levels, checking ketone levels, and recording the results of those
- 6 checks;
- 7 (5) administering glucagon and insulin and recording
- 8 the results of the administration; and
- 9 (6) understanding the recommended schedules and food
- 10 intake for meals and snacks for a student with diabetes, the effect
- 11 of physical activity on blood glucose levels, and the proper
- 12 actions to be taken if a student's schedule is disrupted.
- 13 (q) The board of trustees of a school district shall ensure
- 14 that there are at least three trained diabetes care assistants at
- each campus attended by one or more students with diabetes.
- Sec. 38.104. INFORMATION FOR SCHOOL BUS DRIVERS. A school
- district shall provide a single page of information identifying and
- 18 providing emergency information, including contact phone numbers,
- 19 for a student with diabetes for personnel involved in transporting
- 20 and supervising that student on a school-related activity.
- Sec. 38.105. REQUIRED CARE OF STUDENTS WITH DIABETES.
- 22 (a) At the request of a parent or guardian of a student with
- 23 diabetes and in compliance with the student's individual health
- 24 plan, a trained diabetes care assistant shall:
- 25 (1) respond to the student's blood glucose level if it
- 26 is outside the target range specified in the individual health
- 27 plan;

2	(3) administer insulin to the student or assist the
3	student in administering insulin through an insulin delivery system
4	that the student uses;
5	(4) provide oral diabetes medication to the student;
6	(5) check and record the student's blood glucose
7	levels and ketone levels or assist the student with checking and
8	recording those levels; and
9	(6) assist the student in following instructions
10	regarding meals, snacks, and physical activity.
11	(b) A school shall ensure that at least one trained diabetes
12	care assistant is present and available to provide the required
13	care to a student with diabetes during the regular school day.
14	(c) A school district may not restrict the assignment of a
15	student with diabetes to a particular campus on the basis that the
16	campus does not have the required trained diabetes care assistants.
17	(d) A trained diabetes care assistant who performs an
18	activity described by Subsection (a) in compliance with the
19	individual health plan of a student with diabetes:
20	(1) is not considered to be engaging in the practice
21	of:
22	(A) professional nursing under Chapter 301,
23	Occupations Code, or other state law; or
24	(B) vocational nursing under Chapter 302,
25	Occupations Code, or other state law; and
26	(2) is exempt from any applicable state law or rule
27	that restricts the activities that may be performed by a person who

(2) administer glucagon to the student;

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- 1 <u>is not a health care professional.</u>
- 2 Sec. 38.106. INDEPENDENT MONITORING AND TREATMENT. On the
- 3 written request of a parent or guardian of a student with diabetes
- 4 and if permitted by the student's individual health plan, a school
- 5 shall permit the student to:
- 6 (1) perform blood glucose level checks;
- 7 (2) administer insulin through the insulin delivery
- 8 system the student uses;
- 9 (3) treat hypoglycemia and hyperglycemia;
- 10 (4) possess on the student's person at any time any
- 11 supplies or equipment necessary to monitor and care for the
- 12 <u>student's diabetes; and</u>
- 13 (5) otherwise attend to the management and care of the
- 14 student's diabetes in the classroom, in any area of the school or
- 15 school grounds, or at any school-related activity.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 38, Education Code, as
- 17 added by this Act, applies beginning with the 2004-2005 school
- 18 year.
- 19 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
