A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the care of elementary and secondary school students
3	with diabetes.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 38, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter C to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER C. CARE OF STUDENTS WITH DIABETES
8	Sec. 38.101. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
9	(1) "Individual health care plan" means the document
10	required by Section 38.102.
11	(2) "School" means an elementary or secondary school
12	of an independent school district.
13	(3) "School employee" means a person employed by:
14	(A) a school;
15	(B) a local health department that assists a
16	school under this subchapter; or
17	(C) another entity with which a school has
18	contracted to perform its duties under this subchapter.
19	(4) "Trained diabetes care assistant" means a school
20	employee who has completed the training required by Section 38.103.
21	Sec. 38.102. INDIVIDUAL HEALTH CARE PLAN. (a) An
22	individual health care plan must be developed for each student with
23	diabetes who will seek care for the student's diabetes while at
24	school. The plan shall be developed by:

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1	(1) the student's parent or guardian; and
2	(2) the student's personal health care team, which
3	should include the student's physician and school employees whose
4	duties are relevant to the student's medical condition.
5	(b) An individual health care plan must:
6	(1) identify the health care services the student may
7	receive at school; and
8	(2) be signed by the student's parent or guardian and
9	the student's personal health care team.
10	(c) The parent or guardian of a student with diabetes who
11	seeks care for the student's diabetes while the student is at school
12	shall submit to the school a copy of the student's individual health
13	care plan. The plan must be submitted to and reviewed by the
14	school:
15	(1) before the beginning of the school year;
16	(2) on enrollment of the student, if the student
17	enrolls in the school after the beginning of the school year; or
18	(3) as soon as practicable following a diagnosis of
19	diabetes for the student.
20	Sec. 38.103. TRAINED DIABETES CARE ASSISTANT. (a) The
21	Texas Diabetes Council shall develop, with the assistance of the
22	following entities, guidelines for the training of school employees
23	in the care of students with diabetes:
24	(1) the School Health Program of the Texas Department
25	of Health;
26	(2) the American Diabetes Association;
27	(3) the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation

1	International;
2	(4) the American Association of Diabetes Educators;
3	(5) the agency; and
4	(6) the Texas School Nurses Organization.
5	(b) A school employee is not required to be a health care
6	professional to be designated as a trained diabetes care assistant.
7	The board of trustees of a school district may not require a school
8	employee to serve as a trained diabetes care assistant.
9	(c) If a school nurse is assigned to a campus:
10	(1) the school nurse may be recognized as a trained
11	diabetes care assistant at that campus; or
12	(2) the school nurse may supervise one or more other
13	school employees acting as trained diabetes care assistants.
14	(d) A school nurse may be recognized as a trained diabetes
15	care assistant without completing the training under this section
16	<u>if:</u>
17	(1) the nurse is a registered nurse; and
18	(2) the nurse has received formal advanced training in
19	diabetes care as part of the nurse's continuing education.
20	(e) If a school nurse is not assigned to a campus:
21	(1) each trained diabetes care assistant must have
22	access, for emergency or informational assistance, to an individual
23	who has expertise in the care of persons with diabetes, such as a
24	physician, registered nurse, certified dietitian educator, or
25	licensed dietitian; or
26	(2) the school must have access to a licensed health
27	care professional who is a member of the student's personal health

1	care team.
2	(f) Training under this section must be provided annually by
3	a health care professional with expertise in the care of persons
4	with diabetes. The training must be provided before the beginning
5	of the school year or as soon as practicable following:
6	(1) the enrollment of a student with diabetes at a
7	campus that previously had no students with diabetes; or
8	(2) a diagnosis of diabetes for a student at a campus
9	that previously had no students with diabetes.
10	(g) The training must include instruction in:
11	(1) recognizing signs of hypoglycemia and
12	hyperglycemia;
13	(2) steps to take if the blood glucose levels of a
14	student with diabetes are outside the target ranges indicated by
15	the student's individual health care plan;
16	(3) how to follow a physician's instructions
17	concerning diabetes medication dosages, administration, and
18	frequency of administration;
19	(4) performing finger-sticks to check blood glucose
20	levels, checking ketone levels, and recording the results of those
21	checks;
22	(5) administering glucagon and insulin and recording
23	the results of the administration; and
24	(6) the recommended schedules and food intake for
25	meals and snacks for a student with diabetes, the effect of physical
26	activity on blood glucose levels, and the steps to take if a
27	student's schedule is disrupted.

1	(h) The training must be provided without charge to the
2	school employee receiving the training.
3	(i) The board of trustees of a school district shall ensure
4	that there is at least one trained diabetes care assistant at each
5	campus attended by one or more students with diabetes.
6	Sec. 38.104. INFORMATION FOR CERTAIN EMPLOYEES. A school
7	district shall provide to each school employee who is responsible
8	for transporting a student with diabetes or for supervising a
9	student with diabetes during an off-campus activity a one-page
10	information sheet that:
11	(1) identifies the student with diabetes;
12	(2) identifies potential emergencies involving the
13	student's diabetes and appropriate responses to such emergencies;
14	and
15	(3) provides telephone numbers of persons the employee
16	may contact in an emergency involving the student's diabetes.
17	Sec. 38.105. REQUIRED CARE OF STUDENTS WITH DIABETES. (a)
18	At the written request of a parent or guardian of a student with
19	diabetes and in compliance with the student's individual health
20	care plan, a trained diabetes care assistant shall:
21	(1) respond to the student's blood glucose level if it
22	is outside the target range specified in the student's individual
23	health care plan; and
24	(2) assist the student in following instructions
25	regarding meals, snacks, and physical activity.
26	(b) A school shall ensure to the greatest extent practicable
27	that the trained diabetes care assistant is present and available

1	to provide the required care to a student with diabetes during the
2	regular school day.
3	(c) A school district may not restrict the assignment of a
4	student with diabetes to a particular campus on the basis that the
5	campus does not have the required trained diabetes care assistants.
6	(d) A trained diabetes care assistant who performs an
7	activity described by Subsection (a) in compliance with the
8	individual health care plan of a student with diabetes:
9	(1) is not considered to be engaging in the practice
10	<u>of:</u>
11	(A) professional nursing under Chapter 301,
12	Occupations Code, or other state law; or
13	(B) vocational nursing under Chapter 302,
14	Occupations Code, or other state law; and
15	(2) is exempt from any applicable state law or rule
16	that restricts the activities that may be performed by a person who
17	is not a health care professional.
18	Sec. 38.106. INDEPENDENT MONITORING AND TREATMENT. On the
19	written request signed by a parent or guardian of a student with
20	diabetes, and if permitted by the student's individual health care
21	plan, a school shall permit the student to:
22	(1) perform blood glucose level checks;
23	(2) administer insulin through the insulin delivery
24	system the student uses;
25	(3) treat hypoglycemia and hyperglycemia;
26	(4) possess on the student's person at any time any
27	supplies or equipment necessary to monitor and care for the

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1	student's diabetes; and
2	(5) otherwise attend to the management and care of the
3	student's diabetes in the classroom, in any area of the school or
4	school grounds, or at any school-related activity.
5	SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 38, Education Code, as
6	added by this Act, applies beginning with the 2004-2005 school
7	year.
8	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
