- If a school nurse is not assigned to a campus, the (d) trained diabetes care assistant must have access, for emergency or informational assistance, to an individual who has expertise in the care of persons with diabetes, such as a physician, physician assistant, registered nurse, certified diabetes educator, or licensed dietitian.
- (e) Training under this section must be provided annually by a health care professional with expertise in the care of persons The training must be provided before the beginning with diabetes. of the school year or as soon as practicable following:

(2) a diagnosis of diabetes for a student at a campus that previously had no students with diabetes.

(f) The training must include instruction in:

(1) recognizing hypoglycemia and hyperglycemia;

understanding the proper action to take if blood glucose levels of a student with diabetes are outside the target ranges indicated by the student's individual health plan;

(3) understanding a physician's instructions diabetes medication dosages, administration, and concerning

frequency of administration;

(4) performing finger-sticks to check blood glucose
