- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Subsection (a), Section 431.005, Government 5 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 6 (a) A person who is an officer or employee of the state, a municipality, a county, or another political subdivision of the 7 state and who is a member of the state military forces or a reserve 8 component of the armed forces is entitled to leave of absence from 9 the person's duties on a day on which the person is engaged in 10 authorized training or duty ordered or authorized by proper 11 authority. During a leave of absence the person may not be 12 13 subjected to loss of time, efficiency rating, vacation time, personal time, sick leave, or salary. 14
- SECTION 2. Section 22.003, Education Code, is amended by adding Subsections (d) and (e) to read as follows:
- 17 (d) A school district employee with available personal
 18 leave under this section is entitled to use the leave for
 19 compensation during a term of active military service. This
 20 subsection applies to any personal or sick leave available under
 21 former law or provided by local policy of a school district,
 22 including a home-rule school district.
- (e) A school district, including a home-rule school district, may adopt a policy providing for the paid leave of absence

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	of employees taking leave for active m	nilitary service as part of the
	consideration of employment by the dis	strict.
	SECTION 3. This Act takes effe	ect immediately if it receives
	a vote of two-thirds of all the memb	ers elected to each house, as
	provided by Section 39, Article III,	Texas Constitution. If this
	Act does not receive the vote necessa	ary for immediate effect, this
	Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
