4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 36.1071(a), Water Code, is amended to
6	read as follows:
7	(a) Following notice and hearing, the district shall, in
8	coordination with surface water management entities on a regional
9	basis, develop a comprehensive management plan which contains a
10	management goal describing the desired future condition for the
11	aquifer in quantified terms and which addresses the following
12	management goals, as applicable:
13	(1) providing the most efficient use of groundwater;
14	(2) controlling and preventing waste of groundwater;
15	(3) controlling and preventing subsidence;
16	(4) addressing conjunctive surface water management
17	issues;
18	(5) addressing natural resource issues;
19	(6) addressing drought conditions; and
20	(7) addressing conservation.
21	SECTION 2. Section 36.1072, Water Code, is amended by

read as follows:

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amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsections (h), (i), and (j) to

(b) Within $\underline{150}$ [60] days of receipt of a management plan

- 1 adopted under Section 36.1071, the executive administrator shall
- 2 certify a management plan if the plan is administratively complete
- 3 and if the review committee has made the findings required by
- 4 Subsection (i). A management plan is administratively complete
- 5 when it contains the information required to be submitted under
- 6 Section 36.1071. The executive administrator may determine that
- 7 conditions justify waiver of the requirements under Section
- 8 36.1071(e)(4) or justify certification of the management plan
- 9 without the findings required by Subsection (i).
- 10 (h) The executive administrator shall organize a review
- 11 committee to make recommendations regarding management plans
- 12 submitted to the executive administrator for certification. The
- 13 review committee shall be composed of:
- 14 (1) the executive administrator or the executive
- 15 <u>administrator's designee;</u>
- 16 (2) the executive director or the executive director's
- 17 designee;
- 18 (3) the executive director of the Parks and Wildlife
- 19 Department or that executive director's designee; and
- 20 (4) a person experienced in the operation of
- 21 groundwater conservation districts selected by the executive
- 22 administrator.
- 23 (i) The review committee established under Subsection (h)
- 24 shall recommend that the executive administrator certify a
- 25 management plan only if the committee finds that:

- 2 recognized issues of concern relating to groundwater management in

- 12 (j) The board may reimburse the person selected to serve on
- 13 the review committee under Subsection (h)(4) for the reasonable
- 14 costs incurred for travel, lodging, and meals in serving on the
- 15 <u>review committee.</u>
- SECTION 3. (a) This Act takes effect immediately if it
- 17 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 18 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 19 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- 20 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
- 21 (b) The changes in law made by this Act apply only to a
- 22 management plan submitted under Section 36.1071, Water Code, on or
- 23 after the effective date of this Act.
