- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 547.323, Transportation Code, is amended
- by amending Subsection (d) and adding Subsections (b-1) and (g) to 5
- 6 read as follows:

- 7 (b-1) A passenger car manufactured or assembled after the
- model year 1986 and a multipurpose passenger vehicle, truck, or bus 8
- manufactured or assembled after the model year 1994 that has a gross 9
- 10 vehicle weight rating of less than 10,000 pounds and is less than 80
- inches wide shall be equipped with a centrally located, 11
- 12 high-mounted stoplamp.
- 13 A stoplamp shall emit a red or amber light, or a color
- between red and amber, that is: 14
- (1) visible in normal sunlight at a distance of at 15
- least 300 feet from the rear of the vehicle; and 16
- displayed only on application of the vehicle 17
- service brake and is continuously displayed as long as [when] the 18
- 19 vehicle service brake is applied.
- (g) The observable illuminated area of a stoplamp may not be 20
- less than required under a rule adopted by the department or an 21
- 22 applicable federal standard.
- 23 SECTION 2. Section 547.324, Transportation Code, is amended
- 24 by adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:

- 1 (f) The observable illuminated area of a turn signal lamp
 2 may not be less than required under a rule adopted by the department
 3 or an applicable federal standard.
- SECTION 3. Subchapter E, Chapter 547, Transportation Code, is amended by adding Section 547.336 to read as follows:
- Sec. 547.336. PROHIBITION OF DECORATIVE AND ANCILLARY

 LIGHTING. (a) A person may not operate or move a vehicle

 displaying a lamp, reflective device, or other lighting equipment

 that is not required or permitted by this subtitle or an applicable

 federal standard at the time the vehicle was manufactured or

 assembled.
- 12 (b) It is an affirmative defense to prosecution under this

 13 section that the lamp, reflective device, or other lighting

 14 equipment prohibited by Subsection (a) was not emitting light

 15 visible on the exterior of the vehicle while the person operated or

 16 moved the vehicle on a public highway.
- 17 <u>(c) This section does not apply to:</u>
- (1) a taxicab or other mass transit vehicle equipped
 as authorized by a municipal authority; or
- 20 (2) a vehicle participating in a parade.
- 21 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
