A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to the establishment of a task force to study adult
- 3 education programs.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. TASK FORCE ON ADULT EDUCATION REFORM.
- 6 (a) Not later than December 1, 2003, the Task Force on Adult
- 7 Education Reform shall be established to study and make
- 8 recommendations on improving adult education programs in the state
- 9 through the creation of a coordinated plan.
- 10 (b) The task force consists of 17 members as follows:
- 11 (1) the commissioner of the Texas Education Agency, or
- 12 the commissioner's designee;
- 13 (2) the chair of the commission of the Texas Workforce
- 14 Commission, or the chair's designee;
- 15 (3) the commissioner of the Texas Higher Education
- 16 Coordinating Board, or the commissioner's designee;
- 17 (4) one member representing the Texas Department of
- 18 Human Services;
- 19 (5) one member representing the Texas Department of
- 20 Criminal Justice;
- 21 (6) one member representing the Texas Rehabilitation
- 22 Commission;
- 23 (7) one member representing the Texas Commission for
- 24 the Blind;

- 1 (8) one member representing the Texas Department of
- 2 Economic Development;
- 3 (9) one member representing the Texas Council on
- 4 Workforce and Economic Competitiveness;
- 5 (10) two members representing public adult education
- 6 providers appointed by the governor;
- 7 (11) two members representing community-based adult
- 8 education providers appointed by the governor;
- 9 (12) two members representing employers appointed by
- 10 the governor; and
- 11 (13) two members representing local workforce
- 12 development board appointed by the governor.
- 13 (c) The governor shall designate a member of the task force
- 14 to serve as the presiding officer.
- 15 (d) The task force shall meet at the call of the presiding
- 16 officer.
- 17 (e) The Texas Education Agency shall provide the staff
- 18 necessary to assist the task force in performing its duties.
- 19 (f) The task force shall study and evaluate adult education
- 20 programs in the state. The task force shall:
- 21 (1) determine the need and demand for adult education
- 22 programs in the state, including the need and demand for the
- 23 programs by special populations;
- 24 (2) determine the existing capacity to provide the
- 25 adult education programs demanded;
- 26 (3) assess the retention and progress rate of students
- 27 enrolled in adult education programs;

- 1 (4) evaluate the performance measures utilized to
- 2 assess student performance and the effectiveness of adult education
- 3 programs in the state;
- 4 (5) examine the current structure for delivering adult
- 5 education programs in the state, with a focus on its integration
- 6 with workplace skills training;
- 7 (6) identify best practices for providing the most
- 8 effective and efficient delivery of adult education programs,
- 9 including the examination of practices used in other states;
- 10 (7) evaluate the curricula utilized in adult education
- 11 programs in the state;
- 12 (8) evaluate the professional development services
- 13 provided to adult education instructors in the state;
- 14 (9) evaluate the use of technology and distance
- 15 learning initiatives in adult education programs in the state; and
- 16 (10) evaluate the role of adult education in workforce
- development and economic development in the state.
- 18 (g) Not later than December 1, 2004, the task force shall
- 19 report to the legislature on its findings under Subsection (f) of
- 20 this section and make recommendations to the legislature in a
- 21 coordinated plan regarding the following:
- 22 (1) strategies for improving student access,
- 23 participation, and retention in adult education programs in the
- 24 state;
- 25 (2) strategies for improving the state's capacity to
- 26 provide adult education programs;
- 27 (3) strategies for improving the integration of adult

- 1 education with workplace skills training in the state;
- 2 (4) strategies for building partnerships that create
- 3 pathways of advancement from adult education to postsecondary
- 4 education and advanced skills training;
- 5 (5) strategies for improving the curricula utilized in
- 6 adult education programs in the state;
- 7 (6) strategies for improving the professional
- 8 development services provided to adult education instructors in the
- 9 state;
- 10 (7) strategies for improving the use of technology and
- 11 distance learning initiatives in adult education programs in the
- 12 state; and
- 13 (8) the funding necessary to implement these
- 14 recommendations.
- (h) Chapter 2110, Government Code, does not apply to the
- 16 task force.
- 17 (i) This Act expires and the task force is abolished January
- 18 1, 2005.
- 19 SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect September
- 20 1, 2003.
