## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the grade point average of and imposition of a fee on a
3	student who repeats a course at a public institution of higher
4	education.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter Z, Chapter 51, Education Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 51.9315 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 51.9315. EFFECT OF REPEATING UNDERGRADUATE COURSE ON
9	GRADE POINT AVERAGE. (a) Each institution of higher education
10	shall adopt a uniform policy applicable to all students of the
11	institution for calculating the grade point average of a student
12	who completes a course at the institution that the student has
13	previously completed at the same institution. The policy must
14	provide for one of the following methods of calculating the
15	student's grade point average:
16	(1) the higher grade received by the student for the
17	course is included in the calculation and the lower grade is
18	excluded, except that if the student receives the same grade both
19	times the student completes the course, the grade received when the
20	student repeats the course is included and the former grade is
21	excluded; or
22	(2) the grade received when the student repeats the
23	course is included in the calculation and the grade received the
24	first time the student completed the course is excluded from the

- 1 <u>calculation</u>.
- 2 (b) A policy adopted under Subsection (a) does not apply to
- 3 a course that a student repeats in a term or semester in which the
- 4 student repeats one or more courses that could result in the
- 5 exclusion of a total of more than 15 credit hours from the
- 6 calculation of the student's grade point average under the
- 7 institution's policy adopted under Subsection (a).
- 8 (c) For purposes of this section, courses completed by a
- 9 student are considered the same course only if the content of each
- 10 course does not vary significantly from the content of the other
- 11 course or courses, as determined by the institution. The content of
- 12 <u>a course that changes because of advances in knowledge or</u>
- 13 technology is not considered to vary significantly from the content
- of the course before the change for purposes of this section solely
- 15 because of that change.
- 16 (d) If a student enrolls in the same course at the same
- institution more than two times, each of the student's grades in the
- 18 course shall be included in the calculation of the student's grade
- 19 point average.
- 20 (e) This section does not apply to:
- 21 <u>(1) a graduate-level course or a course in which a</u>
- 22 student enrolls for credit in a postgraduate program; or
- 23 (2) a course that a student completed the first time
- 24 before the 2004 fall semester.
- 25 (f) The exclusion of a grade received for a course under
- 26 this section does not authorize the institution to change the
- 27 student's permanent record. The transcript and permanent record of

- 1 a student from whose grade point average calculation a grade for a
- 2 course is excluded under this section must include the same
- 3 information for that course, including the grade received, that
- 4 would otherwise be included if the grade were included in the
- 5 <u>calculation of the student's grade point average.</u>
- 6 (g) An institution of higher education may not apply a
- 7 policy adopted under this section to a student for a course the
- 8 student repeated before the policy takes effect in a manner that
- 9 would reduce the student's grade point average for courses
- 10 completed before the policy takes effect.
- 11 SECTION 2. Subchapter E, Chapter 54, Education Code, is
- amended by adding Section 54.547 to read as follows:
- Sec. 54.547. FEE FOR REPEATING COURSE. (a) The governing
- 14 board of an institution of higher education may impose a fee for a
- 15 course for which a student enrolls if the student has previously
- 16 completed the same course at the institution. The amount of the fee
- 17 may not exceed 10 percent of the tuition and other required fees
- 18 charged to the student for the course.
- 19 (b) Money collected from the fee may be used for any purpose
- 20 of the institution and is not considered to be tuition or a required
- 21 course fee for purposes of the funding formulas established by the
- 22 Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board under Section 61.059.
- (c) For purposes of this section, courses are considered to
- 24 be the same course only if the content of each course does not vary
- 25 significantly from the content of the other course or courses, as
- 26 <u>determined by the institution. The content of a course that changes</u>
- 27 because of advances in knowledge or technology is not considered to

- 1 vary significantly from the content of the course before the change
- 2 for purposes of this section solely because of that change.
- 3 (d) This section does not apply to:
- 4 (1) a graduate-level course or a course in which a
- 5 student enrolls for credit in a postgraduate program;
- 6 (2) a course that the student completed before the
- 7 2002 fall semester; or
- 8 (3) a remedial education course or other course not
- 9 offered primarily for credit toward completion of a degree or
- 10 certificate program.
- 11 SECTION 3. Section 51.9315, Education Code, as added by
- 12 this Act, applies to the calculation of a grade point average
- 13 beginning with the 2004 fall semester. Each institution of higher
- education shall implement Section 51.9315, Education Code, as added
- 15 by this Act, after this Act takes effect until the 2004 fall
- 16 semester concurrently with routine computer acquisition,
- 17 maintenance, and upgrade.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
