3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 8.001(c), Education Code, is amended to
5	read as follows:
6	(c) The commissioner may decide any matter concerning the
7	operation or administration of the regional education service
8	centers, including:
9	(1) the number and location of centers; and
10	(2) the regional boundaries of centers[ <del>; and</del> ]
11	(3) the allocation among centers of state and federal
12	funds administered by the agency <u>in accordance with the provisions</u>
13	of this Chapter.
14	SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 8, Education Code, is
15	amended by adding Section 8.056 to read as follows:
16	Sec. 8.056. LIMITATION ON COMPENSATION FOR CERTAIN
17	SERVICES. A regional education service center that acts as a fiscal
18	agent or broker in connection with an agreement between two school
19	districts under Subchapter E, Chapter 41, may not, unless
20	authorized in writing by the district receiving transferred funds
21	in accordance with the agreement:
22	(1) be compensated by the districts in an amount that
23	exceeds the administrative cost of providing the service; or
24	(2) otherwise retain for use by the center any amount

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other than the compensation permitted under Subdivision (1) from 1 the funds transferred between the districts in accordance with the 2 3 agreement. SECTION 3. Section 8.121, Education Code, is amended to 4 5 read as follows: 6 Sec. 8.121. STATE FUNDING [FOR CORE SERVICES AND SERVICES 7 TO IMPROVE PERFORMANCE]. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), regional education service centers receive state financial 8 9 support for services provided under Section 8.051 from money 10 appropriated for the Foundation School Program. The commissioner shall distribute money to each regional education service center 11 for basic costs of providing those services according to an annual 12 allotment set by the commissioner based on: 13 (1) the minimum amount of money necessary for the 14 15 operation of a center; 16 (2) an additional amount of money that reflects the 17 size and number of campuses served by the center under Section 18 8.051; and (3) an additional amount of money that reflects the 19 impact of the geographic size of a center's service area on the cost 20 of providing services under Section 8.051. 21 22 (b) Any money appropriated by the legislature for services provided by regional education service centers or other providers, 23 including federal funds subject to appropriation by the 24 25 legislature, must be distributed directly to any school district that has an average daily attendance of 35,000 students or more for 26 27 use by the district in obtaining the services from centers or other

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providers. The commissioner shall determine the method by which 1 money appropriated under this section is distributed. A school 2 3 district that has an average daily attendance of 35,000 students or more may authorize the commissioner to distribute directly to a 4 regional education service center the amount of funds that would 5 otherwise be distributed to the district in accordance with this 6 7 Subsection. The district may rescind its authorization at any time, and the commissioner shall promptly resume distributing funds 8 directly to the district. [Each regional education service center 9 shall use money distributed to it under this section for the 10 provision of core services required under Section 8.051 or for 11 payment of necessary administrative and operational expenses of the 12 center related to the provision of those services. 13

SECTION 4. Section 8.123, Education Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 8.123. FUNDING FOR STATE INITIATIVES. (a) The legislature may appropriate money from the foundation school fund or other sources to implement initiatives identified by the legislature.

20 (b) <u>The commissioner shall distribute funds for state</u> 21 <u>initiatives to regional education service centers or to school</u> 22 <u>districts within a regional service center's geographical</u> 23 <u>boundaries in the following manner:</u>

24 (1) directly to any school district that has an 25 average daily attendance of 35,000 students or more based on that 26 district's pro rata share of the funding based on its student 27 attendance in relation to the total average daily attendance for

the regional education service center; and 1 2 (2) directly to an education service center for its use in carrying out the purpose of the state initiative for school 3 districts within the region that have an average daily attendance 4 5 of less than 35,000. (c) A school district to which Subsection (b)(1) applies may 6 7 authorize the commissioner to distribute directly to a regional education service center the amount of funds that would otherwise 8 be distributed to the district in accordance with Subsection 9 (b)(1). The district may rescind its authorization at any time, and 10 11 the commissioner shall promptly resume distributing funds directly 12 to the district. 13 (d) The commissioner may adopt rules governing: the strategies, programs, projects, and regions 14 (1)15 eligible for funding under this section; and 16 (2) the amount of funds that may be manner in which 17 funds are to be distributed to a regional education service center for a specific initiative. 18 SECTION 5. (a) The comptroller shall contract with a 19 consultant for a comprehensive review of regional education service 20 centers in this state. The review must focus on: 21 22 identifying core services, as described by Section (1)8.051(d), Education Code, and other services provided by regional 23 education service centers; and 24 25 (2) evaluating current and potential funding mechanisms for regional education service centers. 26 27 (b) Not later than December 1, 2004, the comptroller shall

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submit a report to the legislature concerning the results of the review required by Subsection (a) of this section. The report must include recommendations for a regional education service center funding mechanism under which at least 50 percent of center funds are derived from locally funded sources.

6 SECTION 6. Sections 8.122 and 8.124 Education code, are 7 repealed.

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SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
