A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to the territory and the governing body of the Port of 3 Corpus Christi Authority of Nueces County, Texas. Δ BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS. In this Act: 5 6 (1) "Authority" means the Port of Corpus Christi 7 Authority of Nueces County, Texas. "Commissioners court" means the Commissioners 8 (2) Court of San Patricio County. 9 "Port commission" means the port commission of the 10 (3) Port of Corpus Christi Authority of Nueces County, Texas. 11 SECTION 2. CONFIRMATION ELECTION. 12 (a) On a uniform 13 election date in 2003, the commissioners court shall call and hold an election in San Patricio County to allow for voting for or 14 15 against the proposition: "Annexation of San Patricio County to the Port of Corpus Christi Authority of Nueces County, Texas." 16 The commissioners court shall conduct the election as 17 (b) provided by Sections 62.296 and 62.298, Water Code, performing all 18 19 the duties of the commission of the annexing district provided by those sections. 20 The commissioners court shall canvass the returns of the (c) 21 22 election and certify the election result to the port commission. If a majority of the voters voting at the election favor 23 (d) the annexation of San Patricio County, the port commission shall

enter and have recorded an order of annexation as provided by
 Sections 62.299(c) and (d), Water Code.

3 (e) If the annexation of San Patricio County is not approved 4 at the election held under Subsection (a) of this section, another 5 confirmation election may be held not sooner than five years after 6 the date of the first confirmation election. Confirmation 7 elections may be held every five years until the annexation of San 8 Patricio County is approved.

9 (f) Except as provided by this section, a confirmation 10 election must be conducted as provided by the Election Code.

SECTION 3. PORT COMMISSION. If the annexation of San Patricio County is approved at an election held under Section 2 of this Act:

14 (1) the port commission is composed of seven members;

15 (2) notwithstanding Section 2, Chapter 397, Acts of
16 the 68th Legislature, Regular Session, 1983:

17 (A) the Commissioners Court of Nueces County18 shall appoint three members to the port commission;

(B) the City Council of Corpus Christi shallappoint three members to the port commission; and

(C) the Commissioners Court of San Patricio
 County shall appoint one member to the port commission;

(3) the commissioners serving at the time the
annexation of San Patricio County is approved continue to serve,
unless otherwise removed as provided by law, until the expiration
of their terms; and

27 (4) following the annexation of San Patricio County,

the Commissioners Court of San Patricio County shall appoint one member to the port commission to fill the first vacancy created by the expiration of the term of a commissioner appointed by the Commissioners Court of Nueces County.

5 SECTION 4. SUBSEQUENT ELECTIONS. If the annexation of San 6 Patricio County is approved at an election held under Section 2 of 7 this Act, any subsequent election relating to the authority shall 8 be held in the authority as a whole, and not on a county-by-county 9 basis.

10 SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Chapter 397, Acts of the 68th 11 Legislature, Regular Session, 1983, is amended by adding Section 4A 12 to read as follows:

Sec. 4A. FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE. Not later than April 30 each year, a port commissioner shall file with the Texas Ethics Commission a financial statement that complies with Sections 572.022-572.024, Government Code. A statement filed under this section is a public record.

18 SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect 19 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members 20 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas 21 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for 22 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
