1-6 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1-7 AN ACT

1-8 relating to the name of Southwest Texas State University.

1-9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-10 SECTION 1. The heading of Subchapter C, Chapter 96,
1-11 Education Code, is amended to read as follows:

1-12 SUBCHAPTER C. [~~SOUTHWEST~~] TEXAS STATE UNIVERSITY--SAN MARCOS

1-13 SECTION 2. Section 96.41, Education Code, is amended to
1-14 read as follows:

1-15 Sec. 96.41. [~~SOUTHWEST~~] TEXAS STATE UNIVERSITY--SAN
1-16 MARCOS. [~~Southwest~~] Texas State University--San Marcos is a
1-17 coeducational institution of higher education located in the city
1-18 of San Marcos. It is under the management and control of the Board
1-19 of Regents, Texas State University System.

1-20 SECTION 3. The heading of Section 54.511, Education Code,
1-21 is amended to read as follows:

1-22 Sec. 54.511. STUDENT FEES FOR BUS SERVICE; [~~SOUTHWEST~~]
1-23 TEXAS STATE UNIVERSITY--SAN MARCOS.

1-24 SECTION 4. Subsection (a), Section 54.511, Education Code,
1-25 is amended to read as follows:

1-26 (a) The board of regents of the Texas State University
1-27 System may charge each student enrolled at [~~Southwest~~] Texas State
1-28 University--San Marcos a fee initially set at \$10 per semester or \$5
1-29 per six-week summer term to be used to finance bus service for
1-30 students attending the institution.

1-31 SECTION 5. Subsection (a), Section 55.1724, Education Code,
1-32 is amended to read as follows:

1-33 (a) In addition to the other authority granted by this
1-34 subchapter, the board of regents of the Texas State University
1-35 System may acquire, purchase, construct, improve, renovate,
1-36 enlarge, or equip property, buildings, structures, facilities,
1-37 roads, or related infrastructure for the following institutions to
1-38 be financed by the issuance of bonds in accordance with this
1-39 subchapter and in accordance with a systemwide revenue financing
1-40 program adopted by the board in aggregate principal amounts not to
1-41 exceed the following:

- 1-42 (1) Angelo State University, \$20 million;
1-43 (2) Lamar University--Beaumont, \$8 million;
1-44 (3) Lamar Institute of Technology, \$2 million;
1-45 (4) Lamar State College--Orange, \$3.5 million;
1-46 (5) Lamar State College--Port Arthur, \$2.75 million;
1-47 (6) Sam Houston State University, \$7.5 million;
1-48 (7) [~~Southwest~~] Texas State University--San Marcos,
1-49 \$19.7 million; and

1-50 (8) Sul Ross State University, \$17.5 million.

1-51 SECTION 6. Subsection (a), Section 55.1734, Education Code,
1-52 is amended to read as follows:

1-53 (a) In addition to the other authority granted by this
1-54 subchapter, the board of regents of the Texas State University
1-55 System may issue in accordance with this subchapter and in
1-56 accordance with a systemwide revenue financing program adopted by
1-57 the board bonds for the following institutions not to exceed the
1-58 following aggregate principal amounts to finance projects
1-59 specified as follows:

- 1-60 (1) Angelo State University, \$16,917,550 to expand and
1-61 renovate institutional facilities;
1-62 (2) Lamar University--Beaumont, \$21,792,096 to
1-63 renovate and repair campus buildings;
1-64 (3) Lamar Institute of Technology, \$5,301,960 to

2-1 renovate Gentry Hall and convert it to classroom and laboratory
2-2 use;

2-3 (4) Lamar State College--Orange, \$2,125,000 for
2-4 campus landscaping, renovation of the old library for physical
2-5 plant purposes, renovation of the Main Building and Electronics
2-6 Commerce Resource Center, and demolition of the old physical plant
2-7 building;

2-8 (5) Lamar State College--Port Arthur, \$7,650,000 to
2-9 construct a performing arts and classroom building and to expand
2-10 the Gates Memorial Library and develop an adjacent plaza;

2-11 (6) Sam Houston State University, \$18 million to
2-12 renovate and expand the Farrington Building;

2-13 (7) [~~Southwest~~] Texas State University--San Marcos,
2-14 \$18,436,500 to construct a business building; and

2-15 (8) Sul Ross State University, \$15,175,000 to renovate
2-16 and expand the range animal science facility and science building
2-17 annex and to carry out other building renovations.

2-18 SECTION 7. Subdivision (3), Section 61.003, Education Code,
2-19 is amended to read as follows:

2-20 (3) "General academic teaching institution" means The
2-21 University of Texas at Austin; The University of Texas at El Paso;
2-22 The University of Texas of the Permian Basin; The University of
2-23 Texas at Dallas; The University of Texas at San Antonio; Texas A&M
2-24 University, Main University; The University of Texas at Arlington;
2-25 Tarleton State University; Prairie View A&M University; Texas
2-26 Maritime Academy; Texas Tech University; University of North Texas;
2-27 Lamar University; Lamar State College--Orange; Lamar State
2-28 College--Port Arthur; Texas A&M University--Kingsville; Texas A&M
2-29 University--Corpus Christi; Texas Woman's University; Texas
2-30 Southern University; Midwestern State University; University of
2-31 Houston; University of Texas--Pan American; The University of Texas
2-32 at Brownsville; Texas A&M University--Commerce; Sam Houston State
2-33 University; [~~Southwest~~] Texas State University--San Marcos; West
2-34 Texas A&M University; Stephen F. Austin State University; Sul Ross
2-35 State University; Angelo State University; The University of Texas
2-36 at Tyler; and any other college, university, or institution so
2-37 classified as provided in this chapter or created and so
2-38 classified, expressly or impliedly, by law.

2-39 SECTION 8. Subsection (a), Section 62.021, Education Code,
2-40 is amended to read as follows:

2-41 (a) Each fiscal year, an eligible institution is entitled to
2-42 receive an amount allocated in accordance with this section from
2-43 funds appropriated by Section 17(a), Article VII, Texas
2-44 Constitution. The comptroller shall distribute funds allocated
2-45 under this subsection only on presentation of a claim and issuance
2-46 of a warrant in accordance with Section 403.071, Government Code.
2-47 The comptroller may not issue a warrant from any funds allocated
2-48 under this subsection before the delivery of goods or services
2-49 described in Section 17, Article VII, Texas Constitution, except
2-50 for the payment of principal or interest on bonds or notes or for a
2-51 payment for a book or other published library material as
2-52 authorized by Section 2155.386, Government Code. The allocation of
2-53 funds under this subsection is made in accordance with an equitable
2-54 formula consisting of the following elements: space deficit,
2-55 facilities condition, institutional complexity, separate
2-56 allocations for medical units and the Texas State Technical College
2-57 System, and an additional allocation for Texas Southern University
2-58 for compliance with the Texas Desegregation Plan. The amounts
2-59 allocated by the formula are as follows:

2-61 allocation of \$1,027,070 to Texas A&M University--Texarkana;

2-62 \$ 8,818,023 Lamar University, including an allocation of
2-63 \$491,946 to Lamar Institute of Technology, an allocation of
2-64 \$743,967 to Lamar University at Orange and an allocation of
2-65 \$2,336,605 to Lamar University at Port Arthur;

2-66 \$ 3,007,669 Midwestern State University;

2-67 \$18,021,033 University of North Texas;

2-68 \$ 7,131,692 The University of Texas--Pan American, including
2-69 an allocation of \$1,050,580 to The University of Texas at

 3-2 \$ 6,633,109 Stephen F. Austin State University;
 3-3 \$ 3,640,000 University of North Texas Health Science Center
 3-4 at Fort Worth;
 3-5 \$26,132,524 Texas State University System Administration and
 3-6 the following component institutions, including an allocation of
 3-7 \$3,887,211 to Angelo State University; an allocation of \$5,864,608
 3-8 to Sam Houston State University; an allocation of \$14,479,112 to
 3-9 [~~Southwest~~] Texas State University--San Marcos; an allocation of
 3-10 \$1,635,271 to Sul Ross State University; and an allocation of
 3-11 \$266,322 to Sul Ross State University-Rio Grande College;
 3-12 \$ 7,191,493 Texas Southern University (includes allocation
 3-13 of \$1,000,000 for compliance with Texas Desegregation Plan);
 3-14 \$20,961,881 Texas Tech University;
 3-15 \$ 7,735,000 Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center;
 3-16 \$ 6,974,897 Texas Woman's University;
 3-17 \$36,952,989 University of Houston System Administration and
 3-18 the following component institutions, including an allocation of
 3-19 \$25,986,116 to the University of Houston; an allocation of
 3-20 \$1,659,449 to the University of Houston--Victoria; an allocation of
 3-21 \$3,853,447 to the University of Houston--Clear Lake; and an
 3-22 allocation of \$5,453,977 to the University of Houston--Downtown;
 3-23 \$12,692,873 The following components of The Texas A&M
 3-24 University System, including an allocation of \$3,687,722 to Texas
 3-25 A&M University--Corpus Christi; an allocation of \$1,778,155 to
 3-26 Texas A&M International University; an allocation of \$3,555,651 to
 3-27 Texas A&M University--Kingsville; and an allocation of \$3,671,345
 3-28 to West Texas A&M University; and
 3-29 \$ 3,850,000 Texas State Technical College System
 3-30 Administration and the following component campuses, but not its
 3-31 extension centers or programs: Texas State Technical
 3-32 College-Harlingen; Texas State Technical College--Marshall; Texas
 3-33 State Technical College-Sweetwater; Texas State Technical
 3-34 College--Waco.

3-35 SECTION 9. Subsection (b), Section 62.055, Education Code,
 3-36 is amended to read as follows:

3-37 (b) Subsection (a) does not apply to the distribution of
 3-38 money from the Texas excellence fund for the state fiscal biennium
 3-39 ending August 31, 2003. Notwithstanding any other provision of
 3-40 this subchapter, for each fiscal year of the state fiscal biennium
 3-41 ending August 31, 2003, the comptroller shall distribute the money
 3-42 in the fund among the following general academic teaching
 3-43 institutions as follows:

3-67 SECTION 10. Section 411.050, Government Code, is amended to
 3-68 read as follows:

3-69 Sec. 411.050. CRIME STATISTIC MAPPING. The department, in

4-1 conjunction with [~~Southwest~~] Texas State University--San Marcos,
4-2 may annually produce maps of the state that include information
4-3 regarding crime statistics correlated with the various regions of
4-4 the state.

4-5 SECTION 11. (a) The name of Southwest Texas State
4-6 University is changed to Texas State University--San Marcos.

4-7 (b) A reference in law to Southwest Texas State University
4-8 means Texas State University--San Marcos.

4-9 (c) An appropriation for the use and benefit of Southwest
4-10 Texas State University is available for the use and benefit of Texas
4-11 State University--San Marcos.

4-12 (d) The board of regents of the Texas State University
4-13 System and Southwest Texas State University shall ensure that the
4-14 change of the name made by this Act is implemented with as little
4-15 unnecessary cost as possible. The university shall, to the maximum
4-16 extent practicable, use all stationery and other consumable
4-17 supplies that are printed with the institution's former name and
4-18 are in its possession on the effective date of this Act.

4-19 SECTION 12. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.

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
