## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The motto, "In God We Trust," has a longstanding 2 history in the United States dating back to the Civil War when it 3 began appearing on U.S. currency in response to popular demand; having been formally adopted as the national motto by Congress in 4 5 1956, it has withstood numerous constitutional challenges; and 6 WHEREAS, Various courts have found that the display of the national motto fosters patriotism, exemplifies our country's 7 religious heritage, and expresses confidence in the future; and 8 WHEREAS, The national motto is prominently engraved in the 9 wall above the speaker's dias in the chamber of the United States 10 11 House of Representatives, appears over the entrance to the chamber 12 of the United States Senate, and is depicted on all United States coins and currency; and 13 14 WHEREAS, The U.S. House of Representatives recently passed a unanimous resolution stating that schools across the nation may 15 display "God Bless America!" as a show of support for the nation; 16 the national motto, "In God We Trust," is an additional symbol of 17 our country that has been recognized as promoting a sense of 18 patriotism and pride and that does not have the primary effect of 19 20 advancing religion; and 21 WHEREAS, The United States has experienced a recent upsurge 22 in patriotism all across the nation and during these difficult and demanding times, it is fitting and proper to display the national 23 motto as a reminder to the American people of the ideals we 24
