CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, Approximately 1.9 million Texans have been the 3 victims of sexual assault, and the rate at which this crime is 4 committed in Texas is growing; and

5 WHEREAS, Many Texans have dedicated their lives to ending 6 sexual violence in this state; their work ranges from offering 7 assistance to victims and support to survivors to educating the 8 public about prevention and striving to raise public awareness of 9 this crime, its effects, and the importance of its eradication; and

10 WHEREAS, Each year, the month of April provides an 11 opportunity for the Texas Association Against Sexual Assault and 12 rape crisis centers across the state to renew their commitment to 13 prevention and healing; during this period, educational efforts are 14 intensified in order to inform Texans about the sexual assault 15 services available in their area; and

WHEREAS, The goal of the Texas Association Against Sexual 16 Assault is to ensure that Texas is responsive to the victims of 17 sexual abuse and assault and that the state is committed to ending 18 19 sexual violence; the theme for this year, "Texas: A No Rape State," reflects the ideal of a state that is intolerant of sexual violence 20 in any form; the theme promotes a proactive approach toward ending 21 22 sexual assault by educating and mobilizing Texans on every front; 23 and

24 WHEREAS, The safety of Texans tomorrow depends on our
