SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 1 WHEREAS, The Legislature of the State of Texas joins the 2 citizens of Midland and West Texas in mourning the loss of William 3 H. Collyns, who died February 18, 2003, at the age of 94; and 4 5 WHEREAS, Bill Collyns was born November 11, 1908, in San 6 Angelo and moved from McCamey with Humble Oil & Refining Company to 7 Midland in 1935; he served as manager of the Midland Chamber of Commerce from 1936 to 1946, with the exception of two years in the 8 United States Army, and he later served as the chamber's president; 9 10 from 1946 until he retired in 1980, he was editor of the Midland 11 Reporter-Telegram; and WHEREAS, Bill Collyns cultivated the Midland spirit and both 12 witnessed and helped Midland grow from a town of 5,000 people to a 13 progressive, bustling city of 100,000 and the center of the oil 14 industry; he was such an avid booster of his community that he was 15 popularly known as the ambassador for both Midland and West Texas; 16 17 and WHEREAS, He was instrumental in bringing a United States Army 18 19 Air Force base to Midland, and the city became home to the nation's 20 largest bombardier school during World War II; he also worked to develop the aviation center that is now Midland International 21 22 Airport; and WHEREAS, He continued to herald Midland's assets 23 and

qualities, especially its people, and received many newspaper and

- 2 by the Jaycees as Outstanding Young Man of 1943 to receiving the
- 3 2001 West Texas Hall of Fame Award; and
- WHEREAS, Highly respected for his accomplishments and his
- 5 leadership in his community he was known as "Mr. Midland," "Mr. West
- 6 Texas," and "Mr. Permian Basin"; he was instrumental in developing
- 7 the Permian Basin's transportation infrastructure, and he was
- 8 inducted into the West Texas Heritage Hall of Fame and the Permian
- 9 Basin Petroleum Museum Hall of Fame; and
- 10 WHEREAS, An exemplary and distinguished gentleman, he was a
- 11 man of great faith and a loyal member, elder emeritus, and trustee
- 12 for the First Presbyterian Church of Midland; he was preceded in
- death by his wife, Alice Collyns, who died in 1997; and
- WHEREAS, A man of integrity, strength, and generosity, Bill
- 15 Collyns gave unselfishly of his time to others, and his wisdom,
- 16 warmth, and valued counsel will not be forgotten by those who knew
- 17 him; and
- WHEREAS, Bill Collyns was a devoted husband, father, and
- 19 grandfather, and he leaves behind memories that will be treasured
- 20 forever by his family and many friends; now, therefore, be it
