

1 hereby direct the White-tailed Deer Advisory Committee to address
2 how habitat relates to the ecological diversity of the state and to
3 study the role of the wildlife biologist in the development of
4 management plans and in the utilization of suitable management
5 practices, including population goals and control, yearly census
6 data, supplemental feeding and food plots, and genetic management;
7 and, be it further

8 RESOLVED, That the 78th Legislature direct the White-tailed
9 Deer Advisory Committee to study current deer management permits to
10 determine how to provide flexibility and economic incentives for
11 private landowners in preserving wildlife habitat; and, be it
12 further

13 RESOLVED, That the 78th Legislature direct the White-tailed
14 Deer Advisory Committee to meet with the members or staff of the
15 Senate Committee on Natural Resources, the members or staff of the
16 House Committee on State Cultural and Recreational Resources, and
17 the staff of the Parks and Wildlife Department on a quarterly basis
18 and to report findings from each meeting to the chairman of the
19 Senate Committee on Natural Resources, the chairman of the House
20 Committee on State Cultural and Recreational Resources, and the
21 chairman of the Parks and Wildlife Commission; and, be it further

22 RESOLVED, That the secretary of state forward an official
23 copy of this resolution to the lieutenant governor, the speaker of
24 the house of representatives, the chairman of the Senate Natural
25 Resources Committee, the chairman of the House State Cultural and
26 Recreational Resources Committee, and the executive director of the
27 Parks and Wildlife Department.
