WHEREAS, The bill contains technical errors that should be

4 corrected; now, therefore, be it

5 RESOLVED by the 78th Legislature of the State of Texas, That 6 the enrolling clerk of the senate be instructed to make the 7 following correction:

Add a new Article 9 to the bill to read as follows, renumber 9 existing Article 9 as Article 10, and renumber the sections of 10 existing Article 9 accordingly:

ARTICLE 9. SECURITY OFFICERS

SECTION 9.01. (a) Section 51.214, Education Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 51.214. SECURITY OFFICERS FOR MEDICAL CORPORATIONS IN 14 CERTAIN MUNICIPALITIES. (a) In any municipality with a population 15 of 1.18 million or more, the governing board of a private, nonprofit 16 medical corporation that provides security services for an 17 18 institution of higher education or a private postsecondary educational institution and other entities located within the same 19 medical complex, or that provides security services for a branch of 20 21 that medical corporation [complex], may employ and commission security personnel to enforce the law of this state within the 22 jurisdiction designated by Subsection (c) [at the medical complex 23 and its branches]. 24

An officer commissioned under this section may make 1 (b) 2 arrests and has all the powers, privileges, and immunities of a peace officer while [on the property under the control and 3 4 jurisdiction of the medical corporation or while otherwise] 5 performing the officer's [his] assigned duties within the 6 jurisdiction designated by Subsection (c). An officer assigned to duty and commissioned shall take and file the oath required of peace 7 8 officers and shall execute and file a good and sufficient bond in 9 the sum of \$1,000, payable to the governor, with two or more good and sufficient sureties, conditioned that the officer [he] will 10 fairly, impartially, and faithfully perform the duties required of 11 the officer [him] by law. The bond may be sued on from time to time 12 in the name of the person injured until the whole amount is 13 14 recovered.

15 (c) The jurisdiction of an officer commissioned under this 16 section is limited to:

17 (1) property owned, leased, managed, or controlled by 18 <u>the medical corporation; and</u>

19(2) a street or alley that abuts the property or an20easement in or a right-of-way over or through the property.

21 (d) An officer commissioned by a medical corporation under 22 this section is not entitled to compensation or benefits provided 23 by this state or a political subdivision of this state.

24 (e) The state or a political subdivision of this state is 25 not liable for an act or omission of an officer commissioned under 26 this section during the performance of the officer's assigned 27 duties.

1 (f) A medical corporation may not commission a person under 2 this section unless the person obtains a peace officer license 3 issued by the Commission on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and 4 Education. The medical corporation shall pay to the Commission on 5 Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education on behalf of an 6 employee any fees that are necessary to obtain a required license.

7 <u>(g) A person's commission and any authority to act as an</u> 8 officer under this section are automatically revoked if the 9 person's employment with a medical corporation is terminated for 10 any reason.

(b) This section takes effect September 1, 2003.

A person commissioned before the effective date of this 12 (c) section by a private nonprofit medical corporation under Section 13 51.214, Education Code, must obtain a peace officer license issued 14 15 by the Commission on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education not later than September 1, 2004. If that person does not 16 17 obtain the license by that date, the person's commission and any authority to act as an officer under Section 51.214, Education 18 Code, as amended by this section, are automatically revoked. 19
