JOINT RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
SECTION 1. Subsection (b), Section 40, Article XVI, Texas
Constitution, is amended to read as follows:

State employees or other individuals who receive all or 9 (b) part of their compensation either directly or indirectly from funds 10 of the State of Texas and who are not State officers, shall not be 11 barred from serving as members of the governing bodies of school 12 13 districts, cities, towns, or other local governmental districts. Such State employees or other individuals may not receive a salary 14 15 for serving as members of such governing bodies, except that a schoolteacher, retired schoolteacher, <u>college professor, retired</u> 16 college professor, or retired school administrator may receive 17 compensation for serving as a member of a governing body of a school 18 19 district, city, town, or local governmental district, including a water district created under Section 59, Article XVI, or Section 20 52, Article III. 21

22 SECTION 2. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be 23 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 4, 2003. 24 The ballot shall be printed to provide for voting for or against the
