A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 proposing a constitutional amendment to clarify the circumstances
- 2 in which the governor and legislature may take certain actions to
- 3 ensure the continuity of state and local government in the event of
- 4 an enemy attack or threat of enemy attack and authorizing the
- 5 legislature to meet by telecommunications in that event.
- 6 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Sections 62(a) and (c), Article III, Texas 8 Constitution, are amended to read as follows:
- 9 (a) The Legislature, in order to insure continuity of state
- 10 and local governmental operations in periods of emergency resulting
- 11 from disasters caused by enemy attack, <u>including an attack by a</u>
- 12 person or group other than a foreign government, shall have the
- 13 power and the immediate duty to provide for prompt and temporary
- 14 succession to the powers and duties of public offices, of whatever
- 15 nature and whether filled by election or appointment, the
- 16 incumbents of which may become unavailable for carrying on the
- 17 powers and duties of such offices. Provided, however, that Article
- 18 I of the Constitution of Texas, known as the "Bill of Rights" shall
- 19 not be in any manner affected, amended, impaired, suspended,
- 20 repealed or suspended hereby.
- (c) When such a period of emergency or the immediate threat
- 22 of enemy attack exists, the Governor, after consulting with the
- 23 Lieutenant Governor and the Speaker of the House of
- 24 Representatives, may suspend the constitutional requirement that

the Legislature hold its sessions in Austin, the seat government. When this requirement has been suspended, the Governor shall determine a place other than Austin at which the Legislature will hold its sessions during such period of emergency or immediate threat of enemy attack and may authorize the Legislature to hold its sessions by telecommunications so that the members are not required to assemble in one place to conduct business. The Governor shall notify the Lieutenant Governor and the Speaker of the House of Representatives of the place and time at which the Legislature will meet or that the Legislature may meet by telecommunications. The Governor may take security precautions, consistent with the state of emergency, in determining the extent to which that information may be released.

SECTION 2. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 4, 2003. The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the proposition: "The constitutional amendment to clarify the circumstances in which the governor and legislature may take certain actions to ensure the continuity of state and local government in the event of an enemy attack or threat of enemy attack and authorizing the legislature to meet by telecommunications in that event."
