WHEREAS, Homer was an enthusiastic volunteer who set an example for others in performing public service; he was especially committed to his association with the United States Coast Guard Auxiliary, Fifth District, Southern Region; and

WHEREAS, As a member of the Coast Guard Auxiliary, he was noted for his dependability and professionalism and was highly respected by the members of Flotilla 32, the United States Coast Guard, and the recreational boating public; and

WHEREAS, A man of integrity, strength, and generosity, Homer gave willingly of his time to others, and his wisdom, warmth, and valued counsel will not be forgotten by those who knew him; and

WHEREAS, Homer Wright lived his life to the fullest, and he leaves behind memories that will be treasured forever by his family and many friends; now, therefore, be it
