WHEREAS, A leader in public education, Alfred served as department chairman at Randolph and Judson high schools, as president of the Judson Teachers Association, and as state president of the Texas State Science Teachers Association; and

WHEREAS, A man of integrity, strength, and generosity, he gave unselfishly of his time to others, and his wisdom, warmth, and valued counsel will not be forgotten by those who knew him; and

WHEREAS, Alfred was a devoted husband, son, and uncle, and he leaves behind memories that will be treasured forever by his family and many friends; now, therefore, be it
