WHEREAS, He was a life member of the American Society of Civil Engineers and was active in his community; over the years, he received numerous awards, including the Gibb Gilchrist Award from Texas A&M College of Engineering and the Golden Spike Award from the City of Temple; he was recognized by the Salado Historical Society for spearheading the restoration and preservation of the Dobb's Creek Bridge, which is now located in Salado; and

WHEREAS, A dedicated volunteer with the Boy Scouts of America, Jim served as assistant scoutmaster for Belton's Troop 117 and was the chairman of the Heart O'Texas Council's Camping Committee for two years; he earned a Wood Badge and was a Vigil Honor Member of scouting's prestigious Order of the Arrow; and
