IN RE: HB556 by West, George "Buddy" (Relating to certain requirements in connection with the expenditure of child support payments.), **Committee Report 1st House, Substituted**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would authorize a court to order a sworn accounting of the expenditures of child support payments upon the request of a party. The accounting provision would only apply to child support monthly obligations greater than \$750. Assuming that a portion of the parties who receive child support services from the Office of the Attorney General (OAG) request accountings, there would be an increased workload for the OAG; however, the increase could reasonably be absorbed within existing resources.

Local Government Impact

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
