IN RE: HB1506 by Rose (Relating to single-member districts for the board of the Barton Springs-Edwards Aquifer Conservation District.), **As Introduced**

No fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would divide the Barton Springs-Edwards Aquifer Conservation District into five numbered single-member districts for electing directors and outlines how and when the change to single-member districts and boundaries would occur. The bill would take effect September 1, 2003.

Local Government Impact

Because the bill would not have statewide impact on units of local government of the same type or class, no comment from this office is required by the rules of the House as to its probable fiscal implication on units of local government.
