**IN RE: HB2013** by Quintanilla (Relating to admission and enrollment of certain children attending public schools.), **As Engrossed**

**No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.**

The bill has no direct fiscal implications for the Foundation School Program (FSP) or the operations of the Texas Education Agency. However, if districts deny admission to a student under this authorization, the cost of the FSP (approximately \$5,800 per student in average daily attendance) could be reduced as a result of lower attendance.

**Local Government Impact**

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated. A district's decision to deny admission to students would result in a reduction in attendance, which would cause a decrease in state aid of about \$5,800 per student in average daily attendance lost.
