<b>No fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.</b>

The provision prohibiting school districts from charging employees for lost textbooks has no direct impact on textbook or other costs borne by the state.

**Local Government Impact**

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated. To the extent that districts currently charge employees for stolen, misplaced or unreturned textbooks, they may incur small costs as a result of the bill. These costs are not expected to be significant.
