IN RE: HB2647 by Dutton (Relating to classroom working conditions for public school teachers.), As Introduced

No fiscal implication to the State is anticipated, based on analyses by the Texas Education Agency.

The bill would require that a teacher's professional work environment include reasonable authority to visit the restroom as needed, access to a personal telephone or district-provided telephone in the classroom if available, and reasonable accommodation of personal needs such as having a beverage available while instructing and determining how to arrange the classroom and deliver instruction.
