IN RE: HB3433 by Rodriguez (Relating to requiring a person responsible for closing a real estate transaction to assist a purchaser in applying for a residence homestead exemption for ad valorem tax purposes.), **As Introduced**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would require a person who, for compensation, prepares closing documents for real estate transfers to provide the purchaser of residential property with a copy of a Comptroller-prescribed residential homestead exemption form. Absent a written waiver by the purchaser, the closing party would have to prepare and file a residential homestead application on behalf of the purchaser. Closing parties would be permitted to charge a fee not to exceed \$25 for their assistance in preparing and filing exemption applications, and they would be prohibited from accepting as compensation any part of a property tax refund on the subject property.

Local Government Impact

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
