**IN RE: SB443** by Wentworth (Relating to access to criminal history record information concerning volunteers with certain programs providing activities to children.), **As Introduced**

**No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.**

The bill would allow activity providers for non-profit programs with participants under age 17 to obtain criminal history information on persons who are volunteers for these programs. The Department of Public Safety estimates that they would collect a \$1 fee per request for criminal history information using the agency's automated internet website which would be offset by costs to manage the increased use of the website.

**Local Government Impact**

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
