IN RE: SB599 by West (Relating to investigation and testing, technical assistance, and certain other

matters related to indoor air quality in state buildings.), As Introduced

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

This will would implement recommendation GG 7 from the Comptroller's e-Texas Report, Limited Government, Unlimited Opportunity. The bill would require the Texas Building and Procurement Commission (TBPC) to refer matters relating to the investigation and testing of indoor air quality in state buildings under their control to the Texas Department of Health (TDH). According to the Comptroller of Public Accounts, because TBPC's appropriation would be reduced and TDH's increased by the same amount. It is assumed that the State Office Of Risk Management would provide the annual seminars with current funds designated for risk management training and that TDH could choose to use its appropriation to fund additional staff positions as needed. Also according to the Comptroller of Public Accounts, the transfer of responsibilities and funding would be accompanied by appropriate adjustments in the FTE caps of the affected agencies.

Local Government Impact

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
