**IN RE: SB1459** by Lindsay (Relating to access to criminal history record information by a county fire marshal.), **Committee Report 1st House, Substituted**

**No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.**

The bill would amend the Government Code as it relates to access to criminal history record information by a county fire marshal.

**Local Government Impact**

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated. The Department of Public Safety charges \$15 for criminal history record information from the state database and \$24 for information from the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The costs to county fire marshals to request information from either source is not expected to significantly impact their budgets.
