**IN RE: SB1909** by Lucio (Relating to the regulation of the subdivision or development of land in areas bordering the Rio Grande River and the Laguna Madre and/or the Gulf of Mexico.), **As Introduced**

**No fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.**

The bill would require written plat approval from all county entities that have authority and jurisdiction over the drainage responsibilities of an area being subdivided or developed in certain counties. The bill would take effect September 1, 2003.
