## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

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- 2 relating to the certification of and training for school district
  3 financial officers.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 44, Education Code, is 6 amended by adding Section 44.011 to read as follows:
- Sec. 44.011. SCHOOL DISTRICT FINANCIAL OFFICER;

  8 CERTIFICATION REQUIRED. (a) A school district employee

  9 responsible for the fiscal management of the district shall

  10 complete a professional certification course that includes

  11 professional business practices and provides recognized standards

  12 of professional competence for school business administrators,
- officials, and specialists in this state.
- 14 (b) A school district employee subject to this section shall
  15 attend a training session relating to the employee's responsibility
  16 for the fiscal management of a school district at least once each
  17 two-year period. The commissioner shall determine appropriate
  18 subject matter for and providers of training required under this
- 19 subsection.

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- 20 <u>(c) A school district employee responsible for the fiscal</u>
  21 <u>management of the district who is a certified public accountant</u>
- 22 <u>under Chapter 901, Occupations Code, is exempt from this section.</u>
- 23 <u>(d) The commissioner shall adopt rules necessary to</u> 24 implement this section.

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- 1 SECTION 2. Not later than January 1, 2006, the Texas
- 2 Education Agency shall provide school districts with a list of
- 3 approved certification courses and training programs for purposes
- 4 of Section 44.011, Education Code, as added by this Act. A school
- 5 district financial officer employed by a school district on or
- 6 before January 1, 2006, must:
- 7 (1) complete the certification course not later than
- 8 July 1, 2006; and
- 9 (2) complete the training program not later than July
- 10 1, 2008.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2006-2007
- 12 school year.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 17 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the
- 18 legislative session.
