## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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1	AN ACT
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- 2 relating to the reenrollment of a student in a bilingual education
- 3 or special language program in a public school.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 29.056(g), Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (g) A district may transfer a student of limited English
- 8 proficiency out of a bilingual education or special language
- 9 program for the first time or a subsequent time if the student is
- 10 able to participate equally in a regular all-English instructional
- 11 program as determined by:
- 12 (1) tests administered at the end of each school year
- 13 to determine the extent to which the student has developed oral and
- 14 written language proficiency and specific language skills in both
- the student's primary language and English;
- 16 (2) an achievement score at or above the 40th
- 17 percentile in the reading and language arts sections of an English
- 18 standardized test approved by the agency; and
- 19 (3) other indications of a student's overall progress,
- 20 including criterion-referenced test scores, subjective teacher
- 21 evaluation, and parental evaluation.
- 22 SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 29, Education Code, is
- 23 amended by adding Section 29.0561 to read as follows:
- Sec. 29.0561. CONSIDERATION; REENROLLMENT. (a) For the

- 1 first two school years after a student is transferred out of a
- 2 bilingual education or special language program under Section
- 3 29.056(g), the language proficiency assessment committee shall
- 4 consider:
- 5 (1) the total amount of time the student has been
- 6 enrolled in a bilingual education or special language program;
- 7 (2) the student's grades each grading period in each
- 8 subject in the foundation curriculum under Section 28.002(a)(1);
- 9 (3) the student's performance on each assessment
- instrument required under Section 39.023(a) or (c);
- 11 (4) the number of credits toward high school
- 12 graduation the student has earned, as applicable; and
- 13 (5) any disciplinary actions taken against the student
- 14 under Subchapter A, Chapter 37.
- (b) If, during any grading period during the first two
- 16 school years after a student is transferred out of a bilingual
- education or special language program under Section 29.056(g), the
- 18 student earns a failing grade in a subject in the foundation
- 19 curriculum under Section 28.002(a)(1), the language proficiency
- 20 assessment committee shall reevaluate the student to determine if
- 21 the student should reenroll in the bilingual education or special
- 22 language program. Based on the reevaluation, the committee may
- 23 <u>arrange for intensive instruction for the student or may reenroll</u>
- 24 the student in the program.
- 25 SECTION 3. Section 29.056(h), Education Code, is repealed.
- 26 SECTION 4. This Act applies beginning with the 2005-2006
- 27 school year.

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SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the legislative session.
