A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to Mexican American studies programs and course work at

3 certain public junior colleges.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 130.0102, Education Code, is amended to

6 read as follows:

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7 Sec. 130.0102. MEXICAN AMERICAN STUDIES PROGRAM OR COURSE

8 WORK. (a) [The governing board of a public junior college district

located in one or more counties with a substantial and growing

Mexican American population shall evaluate the demand for and

feasibility of establishing a Mexican American studies program or

12 other course work in Mexican American studies at one or more junior

colleges in the district. With approval of the Texas Higher

Education Coordinating Board, the governing board of a junior

15 college district located in one or more counties with a substantial

16 and growing Mexican American population may establish a Mexican

American studies program or other course work in Mexican American

studies at one or more of the junior [any of those] colleges in the

district if the governing board determines that such a program or

course work is desirable and feasible.

21 (b) Not later than June 1, 2006, and not later than June 1 of

22 each 10th year after 2006, the governing board of a junior college

district that has not established a Mexican American studies

24 program or course work under Subsection (a) shall conduct a study to

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- 1 <u>evaluate the demand for and the feasibility of establishing a</u>
- 2 program or course work under Subsection (a) at one or more junior
- 3 colleges in the district. The study must include consideration of
- 4 the diversity of and educational needs and attainment of the
- 5 population of the district and the region in which the district is
- 6 located and the adequacy of the institution's resources to maintain
- 7 a program or course work under Subsection (a).
- 8 (c) The governing board shall establish an advisory
- 9 committee or retain one or more individuals or entities with
- 10 relevant experience and expertise to perform or assist in the
- 11 performance of the study required by Subsection (b). To the extent
- 12 permitted by law, the governing board shall make a good faith effort
- 13 to solicit and encourage the use of historically underutilized
- 14 businesses in performing the study.
- 15 (d) Any resident of the junior college district may bring an
- action to enforce Subsection (b) and, if the claim is successful,
- 17 may recover reasonable and necessary attorney's fees and court
- 18 costs.
- 19 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect November 1, 2005.
