| 10 | DEVELOPMENT PURPOSES. (a) This section applies to the use of |
| 11 | eminent domain under the laws of this state by any governmental or |
| 12 | <pre>private entity, including:</pre> |
| 13 | (1) a state agency, including an institution of higher |
| 14 | education as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code; |
| 15 | (2) a political subdivision of this state; or |
| 16 | (3) a corporation created by a governmental entity to |
| 17 | act on behalf of the entity. |
| 18 | (b) A governmental or private entity may not take private |
| 19 | property through the use of eminent domain if the taking is for |
| 20 | economic development purposes. |
| 21 | (c) This section does not affect the authority of an entity |
| 22 | authorized by law to take private property through the use of |
| 23 | eminent domain for utility services. |
| 24 | SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives |

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- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect November 1, 2005.
